

I Just Prayed with Her

During my diaconate formation I did a one-year faith-based practicum by taking the Eucharist each Sunday to Catholics laid up in Sparrow Clinton Hospital. It turned out to be a lesson in humility. I had a phobia of sorts about hospitals. On my second Sunday, I went into one Catholic woman's room and offered her the Eucharist. She declined, apologetically, saying she hadn't been to Mass or confession in awhile. I asked if she would like to say a few prayers with me. I held her hand and we prayed an Our Father, Hail Mary and a Glory Be. By the end, she was crying like a baby - touched by the Lord. But in my mind, I just prayed with her.

A week later, I walked into another Catholic woman's room and she popped up in her bed with a big smile on her face as I started to introduce myself. (I took a quick look over my shoulder to see if one of her long-time friends was perhaps walking in behind me, but there was no one there.) I started to explain why I was there and she said she knew why. In fact, I was bringing her long-time friend with me - Jesus. That's why she was smiling. I brought her the Eucharist, then I just prayed with her. In two weeks, my hospital phobia was gone.

A couple years later, I retired from my job and was still in formation when I was asked if I could substitute for one of our EMs who took the Eucharist to three residents at Clinton Commons. One of those residents was named Therese, a terribly engaging woman, 90 years young. She was very strong in her faith and loved to talk about it. After a few months, the other two women moved to other facilities and the previous EM decided she could no longer tend to Clinton Commons. I time each Monday for conversation with Therese. I gave her Communion - then I just prayed with her.

A year or so later, Therese's eyesight became so poor she


couldn't tend for herself, so she moved to an assisted living facility in Dewitt. I talked to a deacon friend of mine at St. Jude's who added her to the homebound list there. I talked with her a couple times and stopped in for a visit just before COVID-19 hit last year. A couple weeks ago, I was asked by her family to come visit Therese at her daughter's home in Fowler because Therese was in home hospice care. I had one last visit with her. We talked a bit and then I just prayed with her. I was honored to do her funeral vigil and assist at her funeral Mass.

I had seen Therese only once in a year-and-a-half, but her daughters told me that she talked of me often. It was humbling to hear how much my visits had meant to her.

But this is not "deacon-only" territory, my friends. We can all do this. Most of us know someone who is sick, lonely or in a facility. And really, the Lord does all the work --

we just need to pray with them.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading (Acts 3:13-15, 17-19)

Peter said to the people:

"The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him.

You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you.

The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses.

Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer.

Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away

<u>Responsorial Psalm</u> (Ps 4:2, 4, 7-8, 9) Lord, let your face shine on us.

Second Reading (1 John 2:1-5a)

My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one.

He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world.

The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments.

Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them.

But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.."

Gospel Reading (Lk 24:35-48)

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled?

And why do questions arise in your hearts?

Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself.

Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet.

While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?"

They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled."

Then he opened their minds to under-

stand the Scriptures.

And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Profession of Faith (Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried. and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer


At this time the congregation will kneel. Pater Noster (Our Father or Lord's
