

Compassion over Fear

St. Thomas Aquinas is considered among the great thinkers of all time. Not just among great Catholic or Christian thinkers, but all the great philosophers searching for truth. Yesterday one of his quotes popped up on my daily flip calendar that caught my eye:

Fear is such a powerful emotion for us

That when we allow it to take us over.

It drives compassion right out of our hearts.

I am not a philosopher or a mental health expert, but I think we can safely say that there is too much fear in our world and not enough compassion. Scripture warns us numerous times about not letting anxiety run our lives:

Do not be anxious about your lives (Mt 6:25)

Do not worry about tomorrow, tomorrow will take care of itself (Mt 6:34)

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition...make your requests known to God (Phil 4:6)

That Scripture list is extensive. It is clear that the Lord wants us to trust in him and not let the world's fears (especially as presented by TV news) control us. Those fears will eventually drive many good qualities, compassion included, out of people. But it is incumbent on us to stem that trend through faith.

Enter the Good Shepherd - today's gospel from John. The Good Shepherd uses compassion to overcome fear. His love for his sheep drives him to say: "I will lay down my life for my sheep." There is no room in his heart for fear.

Our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles today allows us

another look at Christian compassion. Through Jesus name, Peter had cured a crippled man, but then Peter and John were brought before the elders. Peter points out how ludicrous it is to be called out and challenged "about a good deed done to a cripple." Not an illegal act, but one which got under the skin of the Sadducees, who did not believe in the resurrection of the dead. Again, we see fear defeated in the light of a compassionate act.

Certainly there are many issues in our world that can generate fear, but it's up to us to be prudent in our approach to them. And let's use our compassion to bring peace to those we know who are struggling with fear. Let's reverse Aquinas' statement and use compassion to drive fear out of our, and others', hearts.

First Reading (Acts 4:8-12)

Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said:

Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you

We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him,

for we shall see him as he is.

Gospel Reading (Jn 10:11-18)

Jesus said:

"I am the good shepherd.

A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them.

This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep.

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold.

These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice,

and there will be one flock, one shepherd.

This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own.

I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again.

This command I have received from my Father."

Profession of Faith (Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty. maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried. and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful or General Intercessions

A collection of short prayers of petition. After each petition is said the congregation will respond by saying, "Lord, hear our prayer." We pray for the Church, Her leadership, the World and it's leadership and then we pray for our parish and local needs.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Liturgy of the Eucharist, along with communion, is the most sacred part of the Mass. Catholics will

kneel during the Eucharistic prayer, but non-Catholics may remain seated.

Presentation of the Gifts and Preparation of the Gifts

The bread and wine are brought to the altar along with any monetary offerings for the poor that may have been collected from the congregation. These offerings as well as the bread and wine (our "first fruits") represent the offering of ourselves (our lives) to God.

Preface and Sanctus

After the Preface prayer is prayed we all join in the song of praise being sung by the saints and angels as they gather around God's thrown in heaven. Sanctus Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Eucharistic Prayer

At this time the congregation will kneel. Pater Noster (Our Father or Lord's **Prayer)** Our Father who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the Kingdom, and the Power and the glory forever, Amen

Fraction Rite — Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) Communion Rite (and **Prayer for Spiritual Communion)**

Act of Spiritual Communion (for those worshiping at home) My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.


