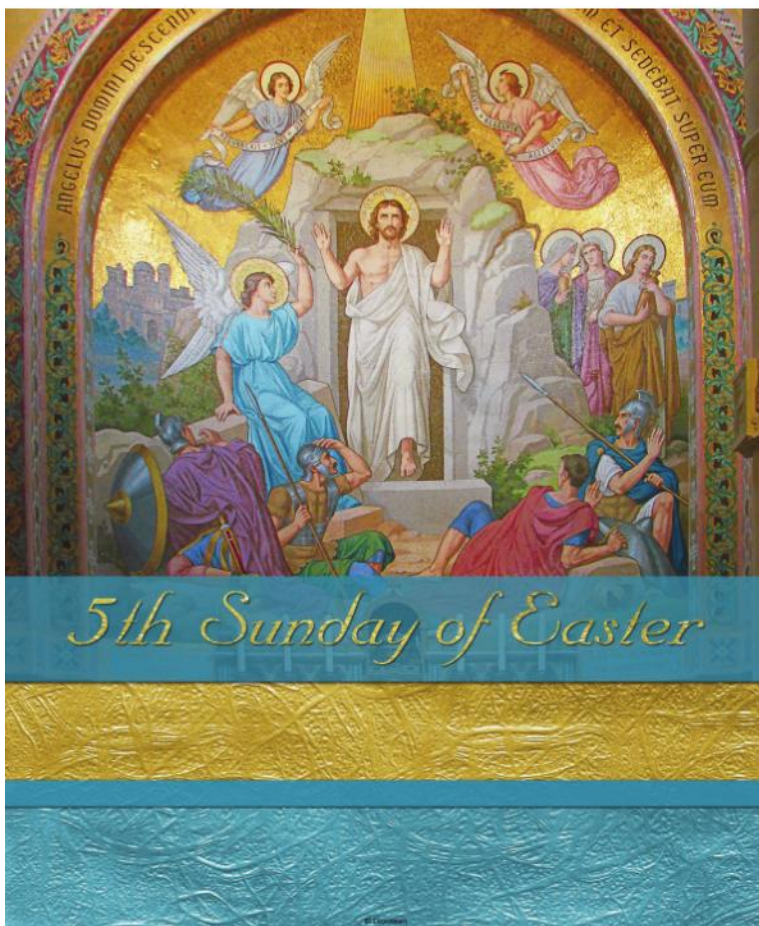

A Family Reflection on St. Joseph By Deacon Marv

In this special liturgical year dedicated to St. Joseph, my mind has been flooded with memories of my family connection with that special saint. Fran was born on May 1, the feast day of St. Joseph the Worker. She served as a registered nurse at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac. A co-worker set her up for a blind date with Walt, who was born on March 19, the feast day of St. Joseph the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin. Fran and Walt married, and I was born the first of their six children in 1942. In 1958, my family moved from rural Lapeer County to Lake Orion, where we became parish members of the local St. Joseph Catholic Church. Shortly before his death in 1963, Walt was received as a convert to the Catholic Church. One of my most joyful memories was seeing my parents receiving Holy Communion together for the first

time at our St. Joe parish.

In 1974, my wife Tita's second pregnancy was complicated with a dangerous toxic condition. She was admitted to emergency at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac. Through St. Joseph's intercession, a healthy baby girl, our second was born. In 1976 we moved to St. Johns, and we became members of our St. Joe parish. In 1979, I was appointed Clinton County probate judge. Presiding over family court cases where I placed children in foster care or adoptive placement, I was often reminded that our St. Joseph is the patron of foster, adoptive and step parents. In 1990, I was ordained the first permanent deacon from our parish, and became the longest serving ordained cleric assigned to St. Joseph. I was privileged to serve and preach at my mother's Funeral Mass in 2009. In my homily I referenced the statue of St. Joseph in her bedroom. I also shared that on her armchair was her little book of prayer with a bookmark at "Prayer to St. Joseph for a Happy Death." At her very last stay

in the hospital, staff asked her, "Fran, why are you so happy?" She answered, "I'm happy because I'm going to see Jesus!" Mother departed this life on October 15, the Feast of St. Teresa of Avila, who chose St. Joseph as the patron of her reformed Carmelite nuns. St. Teresa had a statue of St. Joseph placed in all her convents.

A family member cites the intercession of St. Joseph for the successful sale of a property. She has a close friend who does computer maintenance for St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiac. A sister-in-law serves in the business office at the same St. Joseph Hospital. A brother-in-law receives outpatient therapy from St. Joseph Hospital in Brighton.

Interesting how St Joseph seems to have touched so many of my loved ones! I pray that one day, God will grant me a "happy death" through the intercession of St. Joseph and that I may meet him and my loved ones in the life of the world to come, where there are no tears, no pain, no sorrow.

LITURGY OF THE WORD**First Reading** (Acts 9:26-31)

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple.

Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus.

He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord.

He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him.

And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus.

The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace.

It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 22:26-27, 28, 30, 31-32)

I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

Second Reading (1 John 3:18-24)

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything.

Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him.

And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us.

Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

Gospel Reading (Jn 15:1-8)

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower.

He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit.

You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you.

Remain in me, as I remain in you.

Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches.

Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and

throw them into a fire and they will be burned.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you.

By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Profession of Faith (Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful or General Intercessions

A collection of short prayers of petition. After each petition is said the congregation will respond by saying, "Lord, hear our prayer." We pray for the Church, Her leadership, the World and it's leadership and then we pray for our parish and local needs.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Liturgy of the Eucharist, along with communion, is the most sacred part of the Mass. Catholics will

kneel during the Eucharistic prayer, but non-Catholics may remain seated.

The bread and wine are brought to the altar along with any monetary offerings for the poor that may have been collected from the congregation. These offerings as well as the bread and wine (our "first fruits") represent the offering of ourselves (our lives) to God.

Preface and Sanctus

After the Preface prayer is prayed we all join in the song of praise being sung by the saints and angels as they gather around God's throne in heaven. Sanctus Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Eucharistic Prayer

At this time the congregation will kneel.

Pater Noster (Our Father or Lord's Prayer)

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the Kingdom, and the Power and the glory forever, Amen

Fraction Rite — Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) Communion Rite (and Prayer for Spiritual Communion)

Act of Spiritual Communion (for those worshiping at home) My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy

Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
