

First Communion Thoughts

The last two Saturdays at St. Joe's we have celebrated First Communions. Assisting at one of the two special Masses was quite a joy for me, and brought back some memories.

Since Fr. Mike distributed the Eucharist to all the First Communicants, I was able to closely observe the young ones as they came up to receive Jesus for the first time. There was a boy in the front row who appeared a bit hesitant to step into line. Perhaps he just didn't want to be first, but after a parental nudge he quickly found a place in line.

I had to grin to myself, as I reflected on my First Communion in 1959 - I mean a long time ago. I suppose it was just because it looked better from a symmetry standpoint (and was not a conscious effort to install a lifelong inferiority complex) but my religion teacher lined us up according to height to process into

church and to receive Our Lord. Of course, that made me first in line - an honor I would not have sought if given the choice. So I totally get the young man's hesitancy yesterday.

I watched very closely as the second - and third-graders came up and could almost hear them checking off the proper sequence in their brains bow to Father with outstretched, one over the other; say "Amen" and take a big step to the side; pull mask down and consume the Body of Christ; put mask back up, bless self and return to pew. I could sense a palpable sigh of relief mixed with joy as the children returned to their seats - mental checklist completed. I suspect they have never been more sincere in their prayers of thanks.

For an hour, these seven- and eightyear-olds were young men and women dressed in shirts and ties and beautiful white dresses. They had taken a step into the adult Catholic world, totally aware that they were receiving one of the Church's seven sacraments - even if they are not yet able to fully understand the theological depth of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. I suspect that an hour or so **after** they had left Church they were running around in some play clothes or chowing down on a hot dog or hamburger. That's okay - they're kids. My wife and I let our oldest son play in his soccer game on his First Communion Day so aunts and uncles who normally wouldn't be able to watch him play could see his game. He didn't score any goals that day. I don't even know if he kicked the ball. What I do remember is that, by the end of the game, that soccer field was dandelion-free.

I hope all parents, godparents and grandparents remember the day their boys and girls made their First Communions. I also hope that they help these children get to Mass each Sunday and help them grow continuously in their faith. I pray that those in position to help these children learn Catholicism, do just that. I pray that this special First Communion Day is the first of hundreds of Sundays they receive the Eucharist - and not the only day they received the Eucharist.

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Greeting

We pray the Sign of the Cross. The priest welcomes us.

Penitential Rite

We remember our sins and ask God for mercy.

Gloria

An ancient song praising God dating back to the 6th century

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, only begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen

Collect (Opening Prayer)

All of our prayers are "collected" into one, when the priest prays the opening prayer

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading (Acts 1:1-11)

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen.

He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Fa-

ther has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up. and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9)

God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

Second Reading (Eph 4:1-13)

Brothers and sisters, I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore, it says: He ascended on high and took prisoners captive; he gave gifts to men. What does "he as-cended" mean except that he also de-scended into the lower regions of the earth? The one who descended is also the one who ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things. And he gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers, to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, for build-ing up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of faith and knowledge of the Son of God, to mature to manhood, to the extent of the full stature of Christ.

Gospel Reading (Mk 16:15-20)

"Go into the whole world and proclaim

Jesus said to his disciples:

the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. These signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God. But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.

Profession of Faith (Creed)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful or General Intercessions

A collection of short prayers of petition. After each petition is said the congregation will respond by saying, "Lord, hear

our prayer." We pray for the Church, Her leadership, the World and it's leadership and then we pray for our parish and local needs.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Liturgy of the Eucharist, along with communion, is the most sacred part of the Mass. Catholics will

kneel during the Eucharistic prayer, but non-Catholics may remain seated.

Presentation of the Gifts and Preparation of the Gifts

The bread and wine are brought to the altar along with any monetary offerings for the poor that may have been collected from the congregation. These offerings as well as the bread and wine (our "first fruits") represent the offering of ourselves (our lives) to God.

Preface and Sanctus

After the Preface prayer is prayed we all join in the song of praise being sung by the saints and angels as they gather around God's thrown in heaven. Sanctus Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Eucharistic Prayer

At this time the congregation will kneel. Pater Noster (Our Father or Lord's Prayer) Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us

from evil. For thine is the Kingdom, and the Power and the glory forever, Amen

Fraction Rite — Agnus Dei (Lamb of **God) Communion Rite (and Prayer** for Spiritual Communion)

Act of Spiritual Communion (for those worshiping at home) My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.




