

Fourth of July

Well, I suppose the first item of business today is to wish everyone a "Happy Fourth of July" or perhaps more fittingly, "Happy Independence Day." This year it does feel a bit more like "Independence Day" than it did last year, because virtually all of the restrictions imposed as a result of the coronavirus have been lifted. There is a palpable feel of freedom in the air that's been missing for more than a year.

In preparing for this column, I decided to check out some historical facts about this holiday and found a few fun facts that might win one of us a trivia contest sometime.

For example, our second president, John Adams refused to calebrate the new country's

celebrate the new country's independence on succeeding July Fourths. He felt in his heart that the holiday should be on July 2nd because that was the day in

1776 when the Continental Congress agreed to declare the colonies' independence. The resolution, however, wasn't formally adopted until two days later by that group of statesmen hence the holiday's declaration date.

I wonder, however, if Adams' stance might have been more a matter of of saving face because Adams wrote to his wife Abigail that July 2 "will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival" and that the celebration should include "Pomp and Parade...Games, Sports. Guns. Bells. Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other" (history.com). He certainly wouldn't be the last politician to stick to his story despite overwhelming opposition.

If we wanted to make it a legally-enacted celebration, our founding fathers would have picked August 2nd, because that's the date when most of the signatures on the Declaration of Independence were inked. But think about it.

I mean "who wants to celebrate 'the Second of August?'" (No offense to anyone whose birthday is August 2nd - "party on Wayne, party on Garth".) That date just doesn't roll off the tongue like "the Fourth of July." And one more fun Fourth fact to put forth on this Fourth is that coincidentally, both Adams and his successor as president, Thomas Jefferson, died on July 4, 1826. The cause for a July 2nd celebration died that day as well.

Wow, I'm almost out of space and I haven't mentioned anything about God, religion or theology. But I think it's important to remember that God has truly blessed this country and its people. Our country wasn't perfect then and it is not perfect now. But this is not the space to debate its flaws. It is the space, however, to say "Thank you Lord for our country."






