

SIMPLICITY AND WISDOM

"I prayed and prudence was given to me:

I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me.

I preferred her to scepter and throne,

and deemed riches nothing in comparison to her."
(Wis 7:7-8)

"Hail Queen Wisdom!
May the Lord preserve you with your sister,
Holy, pure Simplicity!"
(St. Francis of Assisi)

"Pure, holy simplicity confounds All the wisdom of this world." (St. Francis)

"I found the simple life, ain't so simple." (Van Halen)

Is anyone confused yet? Don't worry, I have no idea where this is

going either, pending a little infusion of Holy Spirit guidance. Let's find out together where this wisdom/simplicity train is headed.

The quote from the Book of Wisdom sounds familiar because it is from the first reading last Sunday and gives us a lesson in value - the wisdom of God is greater than any riches we can accumulate here on earth. The first St. Francis quote ties wisdom to her "sister". Simplicity, while the second one creates confusion by saying "simplicity confounds all wisdom of this world." And the Van Halen lyric just strikes me as being very poignant. (I'm guessing this may be the first time a Van Halen lyric has been described as poignant, especially when it is taken totally out of context from a song entitled "Runnin' with the Devil." So, let's just take the lyric at its face value.)

First let's differentiate between the definitions of "wisdom" and "Wisdom." The secular definition is "the ability to use your knowledge and experience to make good decisions and judgments." While

the spiritual definition of Wisdom is the perfection of faith, "Where faith is a simple knowledge of the articles of Christian belief, wisdom goes on to a certain divine of the truths penetration themselves." It is a better understanding of God and his plan Francis is referencing when he talks about simplicity confounding wisdom.

St. Francis is one of many great saints celebrated in October, which is why his quote on sister Simplicity came up on my flip calendar this month. He, of course, rejected the life of wealth to live a life of Simplicity dovetails simplicity. nicely with the prudence prayed for in the opening quote, which leads seamlessly into the spirit of Wisdom and knowing God better. May we all pray for prudence, better simplicity and а understanding of God.

I'm Glad You Asked That!: Questions From Parishioners, By: Fr. John Noone

Question: I don't understand the infallibility of the Pope and the Church dogma

Answer: The Pope can exercise the "power of the keys" in making what is called an infallible pronouncement which is binding on the universal (catholic) Church. Infallibility means that the Pope is preserved from error when, as supreme pastor and teacher of all the faithful, he proclaims by a definitive act a doctrine pertaining to faith and morals. Infallibility does not mean that the Pope cannot sin. The Holy Father goes to the Sacrament of Confession frequently and acknowledges his sinfulness at Mass when he says, "I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters ...", and again, when he washes his hands prior to the Eucharistic prayer while asking God to "wash away my iniquity, cleanse me from my sins." Likewise, infallibility does not mean that the Pope cannot make a mistake when he talks about mathematics, science, or some other nonreligious matter. To teach infallibly, the Pope must be teaching on faith or morals; he must speak with his full authority as the Successor of Peter and head of the universal Church on earth; he must make a final pronouncement on a doctrine at issue, and he must bind all the faithful to accept his teaching or fall away entirely from the divine and Catholic faith. Personal correspondence, even that in which a sensitive issue is addressed, is not infallible because it is not meant to bind all the faithful. That Jesus intended to preserve Peter and his successors from error can be found in Our Lord's statement to Peter:

"Whatever you bind of earth will be [have been] bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be [have been] loosed in heaven." (Matthew 16.19 NIV - brackets contain footnoted interpretations form NIV text). Jesus would hardly give approval in heaven to bad decisions by Popes on earth, so He provided protection against this happening. And what was this protection? It can be found in Matthew 28:20 KJV, where Jesus promised that, "I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." And again, in John 14:16-17 NIV, where Our Lord says, "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to help you and be with you forever - the Spirit of truth."

This Spirit of truth, the Holy Spirit, has been with the Catholic Church since Pentecost. History shows that during the past almost 2,000 years, no pope has ever made a false pronouncement on faith or morals. No dogma has ever been changed. Some have been refined to provide better definition, but the core thrust, and effect of the dogmatic statement has never changed.


