

A DASH, A PINCH AND A SMIDGEN

(Every now and then I have a thought that is worthwhile to mention, but it doesn't warrant a full column. When I have two or three, I like to combine them. Today is such a day.)

"Good Grief." We are all familiar with its general meaning - "frustration or irritation." It's perhaps best known from the "Peanuts" comic strip, when Lucy says "Good grief, Charlie Brown" after one of his numerous pratfalls. It's a paradox with a seeming contradiction - "good" is a positive, while "grief" is usually viewed as a negative. But more importantly, grief is a reality and dealing with it is good.

Next month, the St. Joe grief ministry team is sponsoring a grief workshop. It is designed to help all of us dealing with (or perhaps avoiding) the grief that is present after the loss of a loved one. It will be facilitated by a married couple

from Good Mourning Ministry, a faith-based grief support organization.

So, if you're dealing with grief, or know someone who is, this workshop will help provide you with the tools you need to mourn properly. The cost is only 10 dollars per person, which includes a light breakfast and lunch. Registration forms are available at the parish office. The workshop will be held on Nov.19th/20th, Friday evening and all-day Saturday.

Yesterday, my wife and I were outside the Planned praying Parenthood clinic at Frandor in Lansing. A car pulled out of the parking lot and a young female passenger yelled "My body, my choice" as the driver sped westbound across Clippert Street, which happens to be a one-way "eastbound" street. I thought of the irony of the situation, she was yelling at us as we prayed to end abortion, was while she heading the wrong way on a one-way street. I would never wish for a collision, of course, but if there had been a police car at the end of that block, I might have smiled.

A couple of weeks ago, I was listening to a Catholic radio show and the topic was the reality of hell

and whether priests and deacons preach enough on the topic. I really don't know whether it's preached enough or not, but the gospels do speak clearly of it. And the church teaches the reality of hell for those who die in the state of mortal sin (CCC1033 - 1037). In one of her visions, St. Faustina was shown hell and she noted:

"That most of the souls there are those who disbelieved that there is a hell." We know that God is merciful, but we also know he is just.

I know that the previous paragraph is heavy material with which to conclude, so instead, let's end on a lighter note. The title of this piece is probably self-explanatory, but for the cooks and bakers in the audience "unofficial" the measurement scale for dash is 1/8 of a teaspoon, for a pinch, 1/16 tsp and a smidgen is half that at 1/32 tsp. Never use a dash of a spice when the recipe calls for a smidgen - that's four times as much enough to change a "voila" response to your dish into a (You can't get that "yuck." information from just any church bulletin.)

Homebound Eucharistic Ministers

This is a reminder for all homebound Eucharistic Ministers, including those taking Jesus home to a loved one or neighbor. We have a sign-up sheet in the sacristy and **everyone** who takes a host from the tabernacle should record it on that sheet.

Also, especially for those unable to attend our recent EM training, here is a reminder on the proper procedure for home-bound visits:

- 1. Always go directly to the location where you are going to distribute the host no stopping for gas or a quick trip to the store.
- 2. Make your visit a mini-Communion Service, preferably with a penitential rite (i.e. Lord have mercy...), a a couple prayers and maybe a short Gospel reading. (There are pamphlets available in the Church safe to use if you would like guidance.)
- 3. Make sure a clean cloth of some sort (i.e. purificator, cloth napkin...) is on the table before you set your pyx on it. A pyx with the Eucharist should never be set on a bare surface.
- 4. After you've distributed the host, purify your pyx so there are no particles left over. If you are staying or going home after this service you need to purify your pyx by putting a little bit of water in it, then drinking it. If you are returning the pyx to the sacristy you can follow that procedure or rinse the pyx out in the sacrarium (special sink in back of the sacristy.)
- 5. If you are using a pyx from the Church, please return it to the safe right away. You may purchase a personal pyx at any Catholic gift store or on-line. Please have it blessed by Fr. Mike or one of the deacons before using.

One final note - anyone who might be interested in being a Homebound EM, please contact the parish office.

I'm Glad You Asked That!: Questions From Parishioners, By: Fr. John Noone

Question: Please explain the hierarchy of the Church as it relates to the authority for the following doctrine.

Answer: The doctrine of the Catholic Church comprises all those teachings in faith and morals entrusted to the Church by Christ through the Apostles and given to us for the sake of our salvation. As such, doctrine is interchangeable with the whole of revelation. Some doctrines (such as the Trinity) have resulted from definitions which have come from Councils and confirmed by papal authority while others have resulted from papal definitions (such as the Immaculate Conception). Most of these definitions have been formulated in response to heterodox challenges to a particular doctrine. Defined doctrines are not optional and are the authentic teachings of the Church.

The teaching office of the Church, called the magisterium, was established by Jesus the Christ when He promised: "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to help you and be with you forever - the Spirit of truth, who the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." (John 14: 16-17, 26 NIV). The Magisterium rests with the Pope and the Bishops in communion with him.


