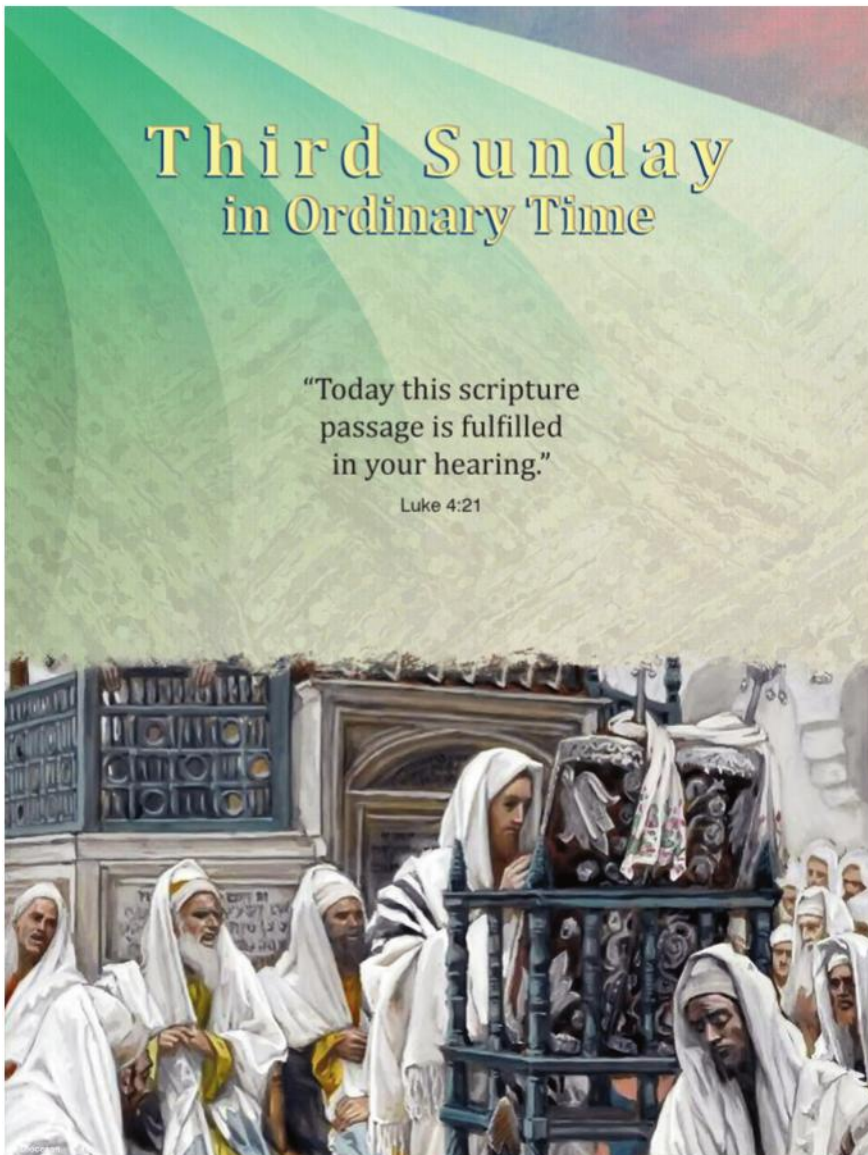

HEAR YE, HEAR YE

Listen up everybody, St. Luke has something to say. For all the Sundays leading up to Lent, we will be hearing from St. Luke's gospel, and today we start from the very beginning of his account. He writes a prologue in the form of a letter to his friend Theophilus. (Luke also mentions Theophilus, which means "friend of God," at the beginning of the second New Testament book he authored - the Acts of the Apostles.)

Outside of his Scriptural work, Luke is best known historically as a physician. And in his opening words, we can see that Luke takes a scientific as well as journalistic approach to his writing - "*investigating everything accurately*" and writing it down in an orderly fashion "*so you may realize the certainty of the*

writings you have received."

To some, it may appear that Luke is taking a poke at his fellow synoptic evangelists, implying that something they've written is lacking. If so, then some scholars believe it is not in the factual accounts (88 percent of Mark's accounts show up in Luke), but perhaps more in Luke's belief that Matthew and Mark could have had a broader interpretation of the events - specifically to show the link between Jesus' life and the writings of the Old Testament prophets. (NOTE: John's gospel was written after the three synoptics.)

This look at today's gospel is a bit of a follow-up of my homily last week when I went into some theological depth on the Wedding Feast at Cana. It's my attempt to show just how deep the gospels can get theologically. It not only shows why bible scholars spend their lives digging into symbolism and archotyping, but that there is plenty for us to discover by investing in study bibles, commentaries, and devotions, as

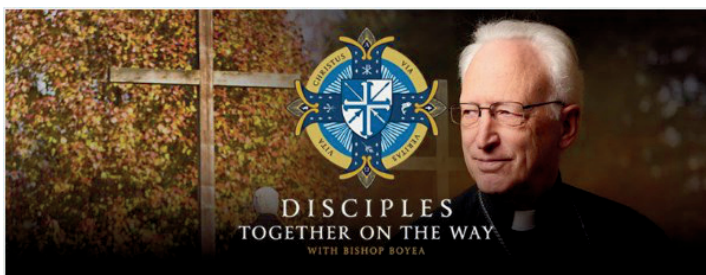
well as the time necessary to benefit from them.

I noted at the beginning that Luke had something to say. The second half of today's gospel picks up Jesus at the beginning of his ministry. Jesus also has something to say. He's teaching in the synagogue and today's concluding line is: "*Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.*" Taking time to listen, let's ask ourselves "what did I hear?"

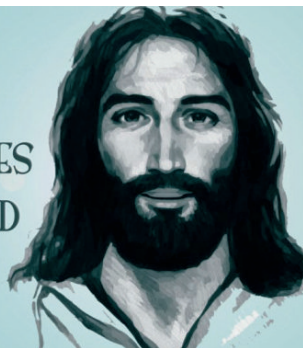
