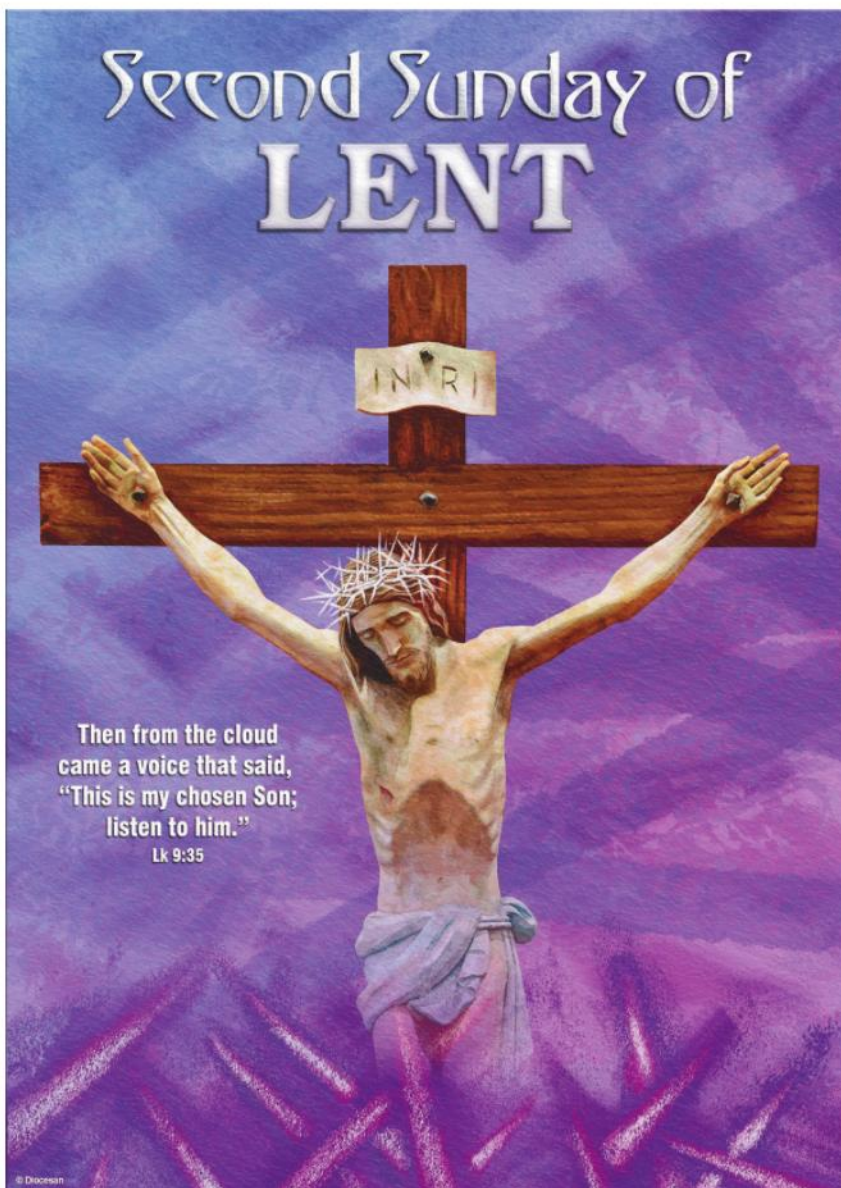

PRAYERS FOR PUTIN

In a conversation with a priest recently, I was lamenting the tragedy of the war in Ukraine and I mentioned my continuing struggle with praying for my enemies - specifically, Russian President Vladimir Putin. And the priest replied that it might be easier if I approached this prayer dilemma by focusing *"not on the person, but on the person's troubled soul."* It's not hard to imagine how troubled the soul is of a man who is responsible for so much death, destruction, and displacement of families such as Putin has inflicted on the Ukrainian people. In other words, forget the face, focus not on the person, but on his soul.

I have noticed in recent years that God often sends me a reminder shortly after he has delivered a message to me. The day after my conversation with the priest, I was reflecting on the Mass

readings for the day and the "Verse Before The Gospel" (which takes the place of the Alleluia in Lent) was this: *"I take no pleasure in the death of a wicked man, says the Lord, but rather in his conversion, that he may live."* (Ezekiel 33:11). God doesn't want Putin and his followers (or any of us, actually) to die in the state of serious sin. He wants the conversion of souls. That's a great Lenten lesson for all of us--the Lord wants us to repent and change our ways, especially those of us in serious sin. There is no sin he can't forgive.

This idea of loving your enemies, and thus by extension praying for their souls, should not be a surprise to any of us. Jesus says it ever-so-clearly in the gospel of Matthew: *"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust."* (Mt 5:43-45) So, intellectually I know what the right

thing to do is, but I still have trouble following through on such prayer.

This is my personal prayer challenge for Lent: to pray for the souls of Putin and others like him --including priests guilty of sexually assaulting children and all the politicians proclaiming their Catholicism publicly then promoting anti-Catholic practices. It will be hard, but my mother always said: "What's worth having is worth working for." Let's work together this Lent to forget faces and save souls through prayer.

NOTE: You can still join me in viewing and discussing the video series *"The Chosen"* even if you've missed the first two episodes. Each week is a self-contained lesson. The series is presented both Thursday mornings and evenings--with an early p.m. start **this week only** at 6:15.


