

BLOCKHEAD AT THE ZOO

Deacon Eric's mind)

"You're a blockhead, Charlie Brown." So Lucy first said to the affable, trusting Charlie some 70 years ago. I've been feeling a bit like a blockhead myself today as, for the first time in a long time, I'm suffering writer's block. I guess that makes me a "writer's blockhead."

Perhaps the Holy Spirit's GPS is off a bit and he's still got me located in Wisconsin where my wife and I were this weekend visiting grandkids. Or perhaps the hot sun on Saturday penetrated my golden dome (actually now red) and singed my synapses as we made our 4-hour trek around the Shalom Wilderness Zoo in West Bend -- in eastern Wisconsin. (If that sounds contradictory, consider the fact that at one point just outside of Milwaukee we were driving west

on a highway with three route or interstate signs. According to the signs, I was going north on one highway while heading south on another. Did I tell you I was actually heading west at the time?)

Anyhow, Shalom Wilderness Zoo is a unique experience. There is definitely an inner peace reflecting the Zoo's name as one walks through the four miles of forested and marshy areas which, with a few exceptions, are the natural surroundings for the 75 species featured there. It's interesting to look at how the animals live, some staying in community and others spread apart, preferring to be alone. Some jumped back when a person approached the fenced-in habitat, while others came up and took feed from the hands of children.

Often when I go to a zoo or aquarium, I am reminded of the Creation story in the book of Genesis. I see all these different creatures God has made and say to myself, "This can't all be accidental." All of these animals

serve a purpose in God's plan. Some may argue that there shouldn't be any zoos and that animals should all be free, but I believe zoos provide great learning experiences for children and adults alike.

Without getting into any George Orwell "Animal Farm" characterizations, it's easy to see some human traits in animal behavior. A peacock strutting his stuff reminds me of some people I've known who like to show off on a regular basis. We watched a couple of turkeys for about ten minutes circle each other like feathered Sumo wrestlers, occasionally throwing a feathered right hook while the other ducked. It appeared to be a show (or showdown) for a pretty turkey in the adjacent pen.

Anyhow, the bulletin deadline is almost here. I guess I'll have to tell Debbie I couldn't think of anything this week to write about. Sorry.




