

Our Adoration Team is always in need of more adorers. We are particularly in need of adorers at the following times.


Volunteers Needed

SOME THINGS ARE NOT FOR US TO KNOW

"We should have the humility of a child, who knows <u>what he does</u> <u>not know</u> but is content that his father knows." So says Monsignor Charles Pope in his look at chapter ten of the Book of Revelation—specifically its reference to the "Seven Thunders." What intrigues Pope is that when the Seven Thunders were about to speak, John, the writer of Revelation heard a voice from God telling him to "seal up" what the Thunders said and "not write it down."

Our Sunday readings give us quite a bit from Revelation during the Easter season, but not this passage. I bring up this article* from Msgr. Pope because this is one of those periods in history when a certain segment of society starts issuing doomsday proclamations, based on Revelation. One current driving force is the uncertainty of Russia's actions given their nuclear weapon capability and invasion of Ukraine. Others see the "end-time" in the collapse of morality in the United States—the most gifted country in the world. The truth is nobody knows "the when".

The Book of Revelation, with all its symbolism, has been analyzed hundreds of times over by biblical scholars, and they've come to just as many conclusions. But what the Church teaches us is that only the Father knows the time. It is our job to have ourselves prepared, to be right with the Lord whether the end-time or our personal end of life on earth comes first. There's no need for anxiety or fear, as long as we love God and love our neighbor as Jesus commands.

Msgr. Pope offers a few reasons why the Lord sealed the words of the Seven Thunders:

It is an instruction against arrogance and sinful curiosity. Usually, especially in our modern setting, people think they have the right to know just about anything. The press speaks of the people's "right to know." And while this may be true about the affairs of government, it is not true about people's private lives, and it is surely not true about all the mysteries of God.


It is a rebuke of our misuse of knowledge. Sadly, especially in the "information age," we speak of knowledge as power. We seek to know in order to control, rather than to repent and conform to the truth—Knowledge abused in this way is not wisdom; it is foolishness and is a path to grave evils.

It is said that a little bit of knowledge is a dangerous thing, which is why we should be wary of anyone who claims to "know" when the end-time is coming. It is why I turn to more learned individuals like Msgr. Pope for even the tiniest insight into the fascinating final book in Scripture. I offer his writing on Revelation as food for thought for the faithful, but not for fear.
