



# Renovation Reflection - Architecture 101

The beautiful architectural styles of the worship space of St. Joseph church each tell us something about the God that we gather to worship. Our God, and are faith in Him, are orderly, beautiful, and living.

A goal of the renovation is to enhance the beautiful elements already present, and repeat the style of these for new elements. A quick preview of architectural styles will help.

Romanesque architecture uses basic geometrical shapes: squares, circles, arcs, and even triangles. Semicircular arches, like our church's barrel value ceiling, are Romanesque. The semi-circular pattern repeats in the arches along the north and south walls, and the arches on either side of the sanctuary. Each sanctuary wing has a ceiling of four intersecting triangles forming a pitched feature. In the renovation, rectangular geometric trim will adorn the facade of the choir loft.

Our God gives us a universe which is orderly and can be understood. Our beliefs are consistent, and integrated. The order and simplicity of the Romanesque styles represents this.
