## A Sermon on Homilies or a Homily on Sermons (Decide for Yourselves)

Bishop Boyea's column in the latest issue of Faith magazine poses an interesting question: "Why do we have a homily at Mass?" His answer is framed by a reference to the story of the disciples speaking to Jesus on the road to Emmaus. These disciples were devout Jews who had been with Jesus for years, but only when the Lord started to connect the dots between what we now refer to as the Old Testament and what the disciples witnessed themselves did they start to see the bigger picture. And when Jesus broke bread before them--Boom!--they had personal epiphanies and couldn't wait to tell others.

That, the bishop says, is the first reason for homilies: to explain the Scriptures. The second reason is, in his words, "to set hearts on fire." Homilists try to take their Scriptural explanation, apply it to the 21<sup>st</sup> century, and ignite a passion in their listeners to connect that message to their lives. The Bishop also looks at the Greek root word for homily as well as the difference between a sermon and a homily and other great insights. So please check out the July/August issue of *Faith*.

Right now, though, I offer my experience, limited though it is, in writing homilies. All priests and deacons have their own process of homily prep, but I'm pretty sure we all start with reviewing the readings and praying for inspiration. Personally, I ask the Holy Spirit for the message he wants to convey to the parishioners in the pews. In essence, I say, "If you give the words you want me to say, I will put them in the right order." I read at least three commentaries on the readings to get the views of scholars. I let it all marinate for a day or more, then write.

Nonetheless, there are many potential hurdles to clear in writing a homily, not the least of which is the topic. And it's not because there is a lack of material. The problem usually is "which of these four or five topics is the one the Holy Spirit wants me to preach on?" I've often started down a path only to find it blocked; started again and hit a wall; then proceeded back to "Go" and roll on home.

When I run aground, it is usually because I tried to go it alone, not listened closely enough to the Holy Spirit. I'm only three years into preaching, but each time I do I learn. Our diaconate formation director often told us candidates to not get frustrated in homily prep. "Know that the Lord wants you to preach well," he told us. That's a comforting thought: knowing that we have been given responsibility to handle the most precious of gifts, the Word of God, and to share it with parishioners. Please pray for all priests and deacons to preach well. Our world needs us to do so.

This is the second in a three-part series on the architectural styles of our church. Part one focused on Romanesque architecture that is simple and ordered.

## **Renovation Reflection -**Architecture 101

Our church holds a prominent feature of the very ornate Gothic style: arches with a point at the top as frame the stained glass windows. The stained-glass windows are also a feature of Gothic architecture. Flying buttresses and ribbed vault ceiling, which our



church does not have, are the main identifying feature of Gothic buildings.

In the renovation, the existing windows will receive even more visual emphasis by limiting the use of dark wood trim to windows and doors. Gothic features will be incorporated into the glass wall enclosing the expanded greeting area.

Another feature of Gothic architecture is "overlaid tracery" that breaks the plane of the wall. Shattered remnants of this feature hid behind the paneling, but this pattern may be reproduced in another form in other places in the worship space.

Our God is the author of all that is beautiful in its many forms. The Gothic style represents this about our beliefs.


