



Scary Amendment

About 70 priests and deacons from the Lansing Diocese and several pro -life leaders in Michigan gathered this past week to discuss the scary implications of the statewide amendment to the state constitution that will be on the statewide ballot this November. You will hear much more about this as we get closer to the election, but I think it is important that everyone be aware of three provisions that should be enough for all of us to vote "No" on this amendment. The proposal will not be named for a few weeks, pending state verification of petition signatures. As written, it's often referred to as the "Anything Goes Abortion Amendment."

The first issue is neither ethical nor moral in nature. It's a legal red flag. What is being proposed is a change to the state constitution. It is not a change to a law. A law **can be**

amended or overturned through acts of the state legislature and the governor. A change to an amendment **cannot** be done legislatively, but only by a statewide collection of voter signatures and another statewide vote.

The second major issue is about who is covered by this act. The opening phrase states that "Every individual has a fundamental right to reproductive freedom." The term "individual," however, is not defined in the amendment. That means a person of any age, including young teenagers, would have the final say on any pregnancy issue, "including, but not limited to: abortion, contraception and sterilization." Under this amendment, parents have no rights over their children on these issues.

A third major issue is that the amendment virtually eliminates the state's ability to regulate any of these issues related to abortion, and forbids prosecution of any "individual" for any adverse outcomes.

So it's easy to see why some label this the "Anything Goes Abortion

Amendment." None of it has anything to do with the moral or ethical arguments against abortion and the Catholic Church's staunch pro-life stand.

NOTE: There is much more on this to come over the next three months in homilies and written material.

Now let's change gears to wrap up. I always like to recognize, even if it's "ex post facto," the feasts of saints in a week that has many. Last Sunday was the feast of the great World War Two saint, Maximilian Kolbe, which was followed the next day by The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The week came to a close with the feast of one of the 37 Doctors of the Church, Bernard of Clairvaux. (St. Thomas Aquinas built on much of Bernard's study.) Look one of these saints up and reflect on their work.

And keep praying.




Recent Renovation Happenings


