

ORDINARY or EXTRAORDINARY?

What makes the ordinary person extraordinary? Is it great talent in a particular field or is it some heroic act of bravery? Maybe it is someone who helps those he/she doesn't know without expectation of reward.

An unknown author once said "Man never stands so tall as when he stoops to help a child." I like that one. But an offshoot of that proclamation is this one: "Man is never so tall as when he kneels before God--never so great as when he humbles himself before God. And the man who kneels to God can stand up to anything." (Lois H. Evans)

I like that one even better be-

cause it dovetails nicely not only with today's second reading from the book of Hebrews but also from my favorite Catholic "Quotemeister," G.K. Chesterton, who observed: "It has been often said, very truly, that religion is the thing that make the ordinary man feel extraordinary; it is an equally important truth that religion is the thing that makes the extraordinary man feel ordinary."

In the book of Genesis we meet an ordinary man named Abraham who went to an unknown land upon instructions of a God he did not know. By faith he followed the Lord's instruction, as chronicled in today's Hebrews: "By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go."

The reading gives a brief account of Abraham's life journey. The thread holding that journey together was faith--a word used five

times in the Hebrews reading.
Faith, of course, lends itself to the type of religious behavior of kneeling and humbling oneself before God as Evans noted.

By substituting faith for religion in Chesterton's quote, we see that it is the Lord working through us that takes us from "ordinary" status to "extraordinary" status. At the same time, faith makes those of us who are extraordinary feel humbled or ordinary. We have a long list of saints who can attest to that.

So, what makes an ordinary man extraordinary? The obvious answer is faith in the Lord. We can all be an Abraham in our part of the world by allowing God to work in us to achieve extraordinary tasks, by kneeling to him in humility. By keeping the faith.

Sunday Mass at the Wilson Center ~ The Renovation Adventure Continues!

We are the Parish, the people of God! Our beautiful church building is preferable, but we come together to celebrate Mass at the Wilson Center, and all is good!

We have been in the Wilson Center auditorium for several weeks now. Every Mass has parishioners who are coming for the first time, as well as visitors, so be prepared to help them along. We thank the many liturgical ministers--ushers, readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, altar servers-who have been serving at each Mass and welcome the others on the schedule as they return.

Each week in the auditorium we settle in a little bit more. We've found a new favorite seat and a new parking space. We're getting used to standing during the consecration. Following are several "loose ends" you might find helpful.

- If you find stairs a challenge, the door at the west end of the auditorium is at ground level and you can easily come in and sit in the front. As always, those in the first row will have Communion brought to them. Also, the driveway by that door can be used for dropping off people with mobility challenges. You can't park there, but it is available for quick drop-offs and pick-ups.
- Song books are available at both entrances. The auditorium has great acoustics, let's sing out!
- There is no tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament at the Wilson Center, so there's no need to genuflect. When we enter, we make a simple bow to reverence the altar and enter our seat.
- As always, it's good to take a moment for private prayer as we sit and get settled before Mass. This is something we'd do automatically with kneelers so it's easy to forget when they're missing.
- We're still working on the details of Holy Water but we can still enter the worship space with the Sign of the Cross.


