"Phew! That Was a Close One"

(First of all, if you're teaching a child to sound out letters or are helping someone from another country learning English, don't start with the word "phew.")

On our way to Tennessee recently for the birth of our new granddaughter, my wife and I were on I-96 between Howell and Brighton, when I decided to pass a tractor trailer travelling in the middle lane. About halfway through that pass, a large van came speeding up behind me, almost kissing my bumper. I increased my speed a bit to get back in front of the tractor trailer and let that van pass.

As soon as I started to pull back into the middle lane, I caught a glimpse of a vehicle also moving into the middle lane from the right, as he was also passing a tractor trailer in his lane. He was traveling at such a high rate of speed, I wasn't sure if he was a NASCAR driver on his way to a practice run at Michigan International Speedway near Jackson or a test driver for an experimental hovercraft. Within five seconds, the vehicle was but a dot up ahead, in and out of lanes like Pacman. It was one of those instances in life that happened so quickly, it's almost as if it never happened at all. Yet it remained in my mind to the point that I had to recount it here.

If that Nascar/hovercraft had just barely clipped my front bumper (and it was inches away from it) it would have been a disaster not only for us, but for numerous other vehicles behind us. But it didn't. Oh, did I happen to mention that we were saying a rosary at the time of the near miss? Did Jesus or Mary or our Guardian Angels play a part in situation? I don't know, but it does make me wonder. This accident-that-wasn't got me thinking about near misses in my spiritual life over my 70 years. How may I have been guided away from a sin or an action that could have taken me down the wrong road? I'm wondering if I were just seconds away from a spiritual collision, but somehow avoided it either unknowingly or by making a conscious decision to steer clear.

I think this experience will help me, perhaps many of us, in realizing what we hear throughout the liturgical year "be ready, for we do not know the place or the time." I believe this can be a good examination of conscience tool for all of us going forward. We must make ourselves aware that a turn from Christ could result in a spiritual collision with eternal consequences. It may be only seconds away, so we must keep our eyes open and our lamps lit.

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON MARV A Reflection on Law and Life
