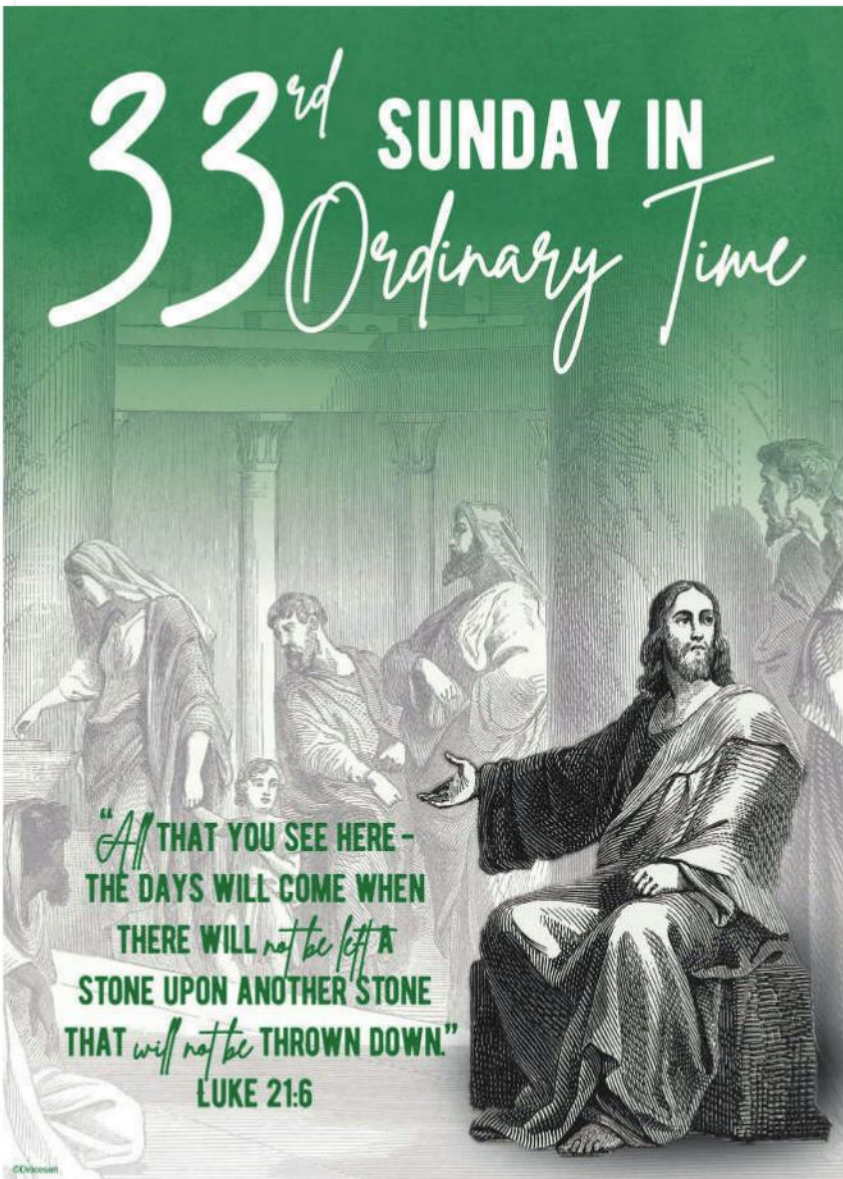

Maintaining Faith After Elections

Since this column has to be submitted early in the week, I have no idea who the victors were in this week's elections--beyond the obvious monetary winners, such as TV stations and networks that rake in millions in political ads during election years. I do know that about half of America will be happy and about half will be sad because our country is so politically divided. Perhaps democracy will be dead by the time this column hits print. That's what some candidates were predicting would happen if their party didn't win. Either way, I'm guessing democracy still exists today though perhaps--make that "probably"--not in its purest form.

My call today is for all of us to maintain our faith regardless of

what happened Tuesday at the polls. Bishop Robert Barron had a great gospel reflection earlier this week that had nothing to do with elections, but his words about faith remind us of who we are as Christians living in today's world:

Faith is powerful, for it is a link to the reality of God, the power that makes and sustains the cosmos. Sometimes, the power of faith is manifested in spectacular and immediately obvious ways. For example, there is a long tradition of faith healing stretching back to Jesus himself and through many of the saints.

But more often than not, he says, faith manifests itself in finding the courage to face difficulties in life. That would include sickness, death, job loss, divorce, and so on. It is when we are faced with faith-testing situations in life that Bishop Barron says we must find within our faith-based courage "the confidence that we are being guided and cared for, even when

that guidance and care are not immediately apparent."

We still must carry on with our lives regardless of what happened at the polls this week. Our employers are expecting us to show up at work, and our kids are expecting us to pick them up after practice. The world didn't end when the polls closed. (I don't expect too many people are moving to Canada because of Tuesday's results.) So, whether the election results made us happy or sad, we need to keep the faith. As Christians, our goals are independent of polls.

NOTE: I would like to give a shout out to all the people from this area who sacrificed many hours a week for the last several weeks going door-to-door and making phone calls in an effort to defeat Proposal 3.

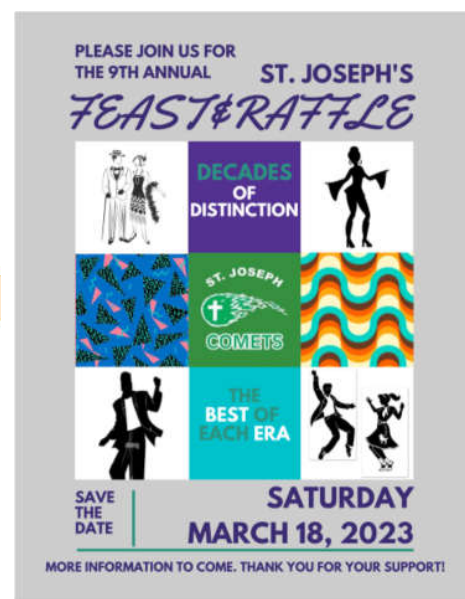

From Fr. Mike:

The Importance of Mass

Did the early Christians think going to Mass on Sunday, celebrating the Eucharist, was important?

First, Jesus wouldn't have commanded the Apostles to offer the Eucharist if He didn't want them to do it. The early Christians did this each Sunday in homes. See Acts 2:42. "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles, and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread (Eucharist), and to the prayers." St. Paul writes of the Eucharist and its celebration in 1 Corinthians 11:23-26, in which he recounts the words of Jesus at the Last Supper and continues, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes." (V.26) The Letter to the Hebrews also states, "We should not stay away from our assembly (the worship assembly of the Christian community, the Mass as the highest, most perfect form of worship), as in the custom of some, but encourage one another..." (Heb 10:25).
