

#### Why Now?

Fr. Mike raised a great question to ponder during his homily last week, although it's a question that probably no one can answer with any certainty. When reflecting on the negative results in our elections this month, both in Michigan and across the country, Father pointed out that there is an awful lot of work to be done by persons of faith. In looking at the overall state of our country, our assignment for the week was to reflect on why God chose us to be living here, living now.

This is an updated version of a question St. Francis deSales posed almost 500 years go in his most famous book *Introduction to the Devout Life*. Early on in the book, St. Francis points out that if we are to pursue perfection in prayer, the first move we should make is to meditate on this question: Why did God bring our soul and our body together in our mother's womb at the moment he did? This, of course, leads not only to the question Fr. Mike proposed about current times, but to the broader question of what our purpose in life is. St. Francis says to always start contemplation with the knowledge that "God is love" and go from there.

It often takes a major event in our lives for us to stop and take note of our circumstances, not only in our secular life, but our faith life as well. The message we received as Catholics on election day is that a majority of voters across the country believe abortion, termination of a baby's life in the womb, is okay.

It's obvious to election experts that the pro-abortion voters are not limited to non-Catholics. Numerous studies show Catholics are split on whether abortion is morally wrong. It is clear that in our state, and dozens of states across this country, this fight cannot be won at the ballot box. It will take not a change of mind, but a wholesale change of the collective heart. That's where Fr. Mike's guestion comes into light. We need to look at our lives and see what we can do to help change hearts--to turn the tide toward some sense of morality in our country. We must ask

ourselves the question Fr. Mike asked: Why are we here, as Christians, at this point in time? Then we must act accordingly.



### From Fr. Mike:

### **The Importance of Mass**

What does it mean to receive the Eucharist worthily?

It means that each of us must be free from mortal sin to receive the Holy Eucharist, or else we commit a sacrilege, which is the abuse of something holy. If I know I have committed mortal sin, I may not receive Holy Communion until I have repented and been absolved of my sins in the sacrament of Penance (Confession). We must follow the teaching of the Church in these matters, and judge our sins according to the Church's teaching, not by how we feel about things, how we would like things to be, or how others have told us things should be. If we are in doubt, we must seek guidance from someone who will guide us in the ways of the Church, not according to personal opinion. St. Paul warned Christians (1 Cor 11:27-32) to examine themselves thoroughly before receiving the Eucharist. He writes that whoever "eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will answer for the Body and Blood of the Lord." He goes on to say that "who eats and drinks without discerning the Body, eats and drinks judgment on himself." The documents that we have from the earliest times of the Church call for repentance of sin before receiving the Eucharist, and those who do not must not receive. St. John Chrysostom (born 344-54, died 407 A.D.), compared the unworthy recipient to Judas, Christ's betrayer.

### Are You or Someone You Love Struggling with Same-Sex Attraction?
