

## What Happen to Thanksgiving?

Did I pull a Rip Van Winkle or something? I remember Halloween because I just put away our Halloween decorations. (Well, my wife did anyway.) And I vaguely remember an election, then again maybe I forgot the results on purpose. Now I have a homily to write for the First Sunday in Advent, which you may have already heard before you read this, because of the early bulletin deadline for THANKSGIVING. There it is, or should I say, was. But it's all coming back to me now. Still, why did I miss it?

Well, actually, I think a great deal of Americans have missed Thanksgiving in recent years for a couple reasons. One is the rewriting of American history by some who believe all the settlers and founding fathers were bad people who severely mistreated

natives of this land. Now there is no denying that there was a considerable amount of wrongdoing by settlers and the government as the U.S. grew westward, but to ignore the fact that two groups of people -- one from England and the other from this land -- couldn't celebrate a great harvest after a brutal winter, is absurd. There's historical writings that prove there was a first Thanksgiving.

A second reason, of course, that Thanksgiving is often overlooked is the continued secular removal of God from all holiday celebrations. The Pilgrims were thanking God on that first Thanksgiving. By discrediting those Puritans, history rewriters downplay God a little bit each year to the point that outside of some church services and prayers around the dinner table, there's little regard of God that day.

Thanksgiving becomes just another day of football watching in many homes. That being said, I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving, showing gratitude to the Lord for all his blessings throughout the year. We should be appreciable

every day, but Thanksgiving is one of those stop-and-smell-the-roses days that really help us ponder all the little gifts he gives us. I hope our Community Thanksgiving dinner was a success and lastly, I hope the Lions found a way to beat Buffalo -- assuming the Bills weren't still snowed in.

All of this leads to the fact that this is the First Sunday of Advent - a short season by Church standards, but a valuable one. It gives us the first couple of weeks to ponder our readiness to meet the Lord. In today's Gospel from Matthew, Jesus tells us directly to "stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." And Jesus' final line today is "for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." The message is clear. If we have not reconciled our sins with God, we best get to it now. Let's prepare for the arrival of the Christ Child at the end of next month, by preparing today to meet him at the Second Coming.


