

CRAZY JOHN

We started Advent last week with St. Paul and Jesus telling us in the Sunday readings that those who are sleeping need to "wake up" and those who are awake must continue to stay awake. That message was to get (and stay) prepared for the Second Coming of Christ. Today we get an earful from John the Baptist about repentance. And to say he doesn't mince his words would be an understatement.

In the streaming TV series "The Chosen", John the Baptist is called "Crazy John" by Simon (Peter); and as he is presented in the series, one can see why that nickname is fitting. Today's gospel does nothing to dispel that. When confronting Pharisees and Sadducees, he calls them a "brood of vipers" -- an especially deep insult since it is known that viper babies eat their way out of their mothers, killing the mother in the process.

The accusation was about as low as one could go.

There is no biblical confirmation that Jesus and John had any conversations as their ministries developed, but the writers of "The Chosen" did present an interesting possibility of them meeting for a short while. From their conversation, John is pictured as a wild bull willing to charge into situations. and he tries to put Jesus in that mode as well. John thinks Jesus is just going too slowly, but Jesus tells him that he has a longer range plan of ministry to follow. Again, this is a writer's perception of what might have happened but likely paints a good picture of their personalities. "Crazy John" was a "stir things up right now" kind of guy, while Jesus was a "in due time" kind of guy. In the end, Jesus assures him that before his ministry would end he would do plenty of stirring up.

So "Crazy-John" is the prophet I see when I read today's gospel, but his message to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" is spot-on. We too often look at the month of December as a Christ-

mas-prep period instead of seeing the season of Advent for what it is -- a spiritual preparation for meeting the Lord at the end of our lives. To be prepared we have to cleanse our souls. That means repenting -- confessing our sins and changing our ways. John's call today is not to a simple purification but to a conversion to a new life in Christ.

The Baptizer's words to the Pharisees and Sadducees were extremely sharp. But his warning to us at the end of today's gospel is just as pointed. He tells us that every tree that bears good fruit will be thrown into the fire. He's even more descriptive when he says that after God separates the wheat from the chaff, the chaff will "burn in an **unquenchable** fire."

The message today is clear-repent. We need to strive toward producing good fruit. And true to "Crazy John's" personality, we need to start "right now."




