

Hope, Passion, Football and Faith

Even if we don't make New Year's resolutions, I think most of us do look at each new year with some type of hope for the upcoming year. From a secular point of view, hope can carry an endless number of wishes. We can hope the coming year is better than the one that just passed or we can pray that the previous year's blessings grow in the new year. Theological hope is a different animal.

Never is secular hope more on display than in the following of our favorite football teams. This year both the Detroit Lions and the Michigan Wolverines started their seasons with playoff hopes, with U of M's the more realistic according to odds-makers. After seven games for each, Lions' fans were jumping ship while spouting their usual mid-season mantra -- "S.O.L." for Sames Old Lions, while the Wolverines' fans hopes rose each week for their undefeated team.

But then, the Lions did an about face

and won six of seven games and were in the hunt for the playoffs. Fans climbed back aboard until two weeks ago when the team blew a golden opportunity to control their playoff destiny. Cries of "SOL" could be heard in the night air. The Wolverines, meanwhile, continued to win, capturing the Big Ten championship and making their way to the college football playoffs needing only two more wins to become national champs. Their fans' hopes soared.

Football is a fickle game however. Last week, U of M started the game with a 53-yard run with their fans pinning the needle on the "hope-o-meter." Three and a half hours later, however, they fumbled the ball on a bad snap (hike) and their season was over. The "hope-o-meter" remained motionless. The next day, Lions' fans' hopes were rekindled with a victory, though the team no longer controls their destiny. We'll know the Lions' fate later today (January 8).

So what is a football roundup doing in a church bulletin. Well, the focus today is not football but hope -- specifically the difference between hope on a secular versus spiritual scale. From a football fans' point-of-view, hope is a wish for a favorable outcome, but that wish lies in the hands of others and its outcome has no effect on our inner lives or eternal destiny. But, as I mentioned in a couple columns last spring, theological hope is "The theological virtue by which we desire and expect from God both eternal life and the grace we need to attain it." (CCC 1817)

This hope note only has eternal implications, but is a virtue that is tied to our faith and subsequent actions. St. Thomas Aquinas wrote of the need to continue seeking God's graces: "we should hope from Him (God) nothing less than Himself...the proper and principle object of hope is eternal happiness." (Summa Theologica)

To have the virtue of hope does not mean we have to abandon secular hope, but that we understand the difference between the two and work toward the eternal benefits that theological hope brings. Let's use our passion for football as a means of strengthening our faith through hope in this new year.






