WE ARE ALL **EVANGELIZERS** (and whatever else is on Deacon Eric's mind)

From Nothing to Anything My old buddy G.K. Chesterton turned

up on the flip calendar again today and, as usual gives us an interesting thought to ponder:

"When men chose not to believe in God, they do not thereafter believe in nothing, they then become capable of believing in anything."

That struck me as something that seem so obvious that I'm disappointed that I didn't think of it myself. If we don't have God as our focus in life, then we are susceptible to believing some ideas that seem so outrageous that it's beyond comprehension how anyone could believe them. Men having babies comes to mind.

The bottom line is that young minds have to be better prepared for discerning fact from fantasy as they grow into adulthood. They need to become better critical thinkers and need a core belief to build upon. Catholic schools prepare children for the adult world. not only in core academics but in the

understanding of our faith. I've had the wonderful opportunity over the past year to baptize about 25 children, one of the many "perks" that come with being a deacon. I mention in my baptismal homily each time of the need to start faith education at home. but it can't stop there.

Catholic Schools Week is just around the corner and this month's Faith magazine is devoted to Catholic education. It has a variety of wonderful articles that are truly worth your time, whether you have school-age children or not. The issue asks parents to take another look at today's Catholic schools in the Lansing Diocese; a guide to Catholic homeschooling; and the rise of classical education. It also takes a look at the presidents of the four Catholic high schools, which includes Dominic locco, a graduate of St. Joe's who now heads Lansing Catholic High School.

The article that caught my eye was a look at classical education and how it is drawing more parents to invest in Catholic education, with its focus on the liberal arts and the three-stage concept of children's learning development. Though the piece acknowledges that a true concept of "Catholic classical education" is hard to pin down, it's

important to note two points: "faith is the golden thread through everything" and that the goal is giving the students "the ability to think."

As a graduate of Catholic schools in Detroit, I am quite thankful that my parents found a way to pay for Catholic school education for 12 years for me. My high schools motto was "goodness, discipline and knowledge" and it has served me well over more than 50 years to strive to live a life that met those goals. Catholic high school education for our community is difficult for many reasons, but grade school Catholic education is very doable. I ask parents to consider Catholic education.

Remember Chesterton's quote with which we started. Look at the part of the world that will accept virtually anything as truth, no matter how bizarre, and we can see how God is our anchor. Without him we are a ship adrift, with no direction and in Chesterton's words "capable of believing anything."






