

Big Hearts, Angry People and Otto

I am not a movie critic, but every now and then I like to share a movie experience that dovetails with the Gospel. Such is the case today. My wife and I recently went to see the new movie "Otto" starring Tom Hanks. Though nitpickers might say this movie is just a rework of Clint Eastwood's 2008 film "Gran Torino," it is different enough to warrant a look. (Besides, if you like palindromes like I do, you have to love "Otto.")

One difference in the movie seems like a shallow one, but struck me as perhaps a light-hearted jab between Hollywood superstar actors. Whereas Eastwood's character owned the Gran Torino from which the title is drawn, it is a Ford product. Hanks' character makes his preference for General Motors' vehicles known a couple of times in "Otto." With regards to their charac-

ters, both were angry people, but Eastwood's character was also hateful and more foul-mouthed than Hanks' Otto.

But sticking to "Otto," the character, despite himself, is a big-hearted person, though reluctantly so through much of the movie. Without giving too much away about the plot, Hanks' anger is a broad one. It is an anger against the world after the loss of his wife -- an anger many of us have experienced after the unexpected loss of a loved one.

Anger is one of the many sins of mankind that Jesus addresses in today's Gospel from Matthew. Jesus acknowledges that we are aware of the consequences of killing someone, but he wants us to go beyond the act of killing to see what lies at the core stimulus of such an act saying:

"But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment, and whoever says to his brother 'Raqa' will be answerable to the Sanhedrin, and whoever says 'You

fool' will be liable to fiery Gehenna."

Raqa means imbecile or idiot. In his anger against the world, Otto constantly identifies those who can't follow simple rules as idiots. In many cases, it's hard to disagree with his assessments.

In today's gospel Jesus also goes on to point out a couple scenarios underscoring the importance of not letting anger persist. I think any of us who have allowed anger against someone to fester know the anguish and hurt from not rectifying our angry feelings toward another. It really helps when we have big-hearted friends like Otto does in the movie.

Actually we all do have such a friend, don't we? No one has a bigger heart than the Lord and he's more than willing to help us deal with our anger. Let's let him help.
