

Faith, Fathers and Hoops

In our Saturday' parish men's group, the discussion recently turned to faith. More specifically, how do we know that we have "enough" faith to withstand a severe test of it? The analogy was drawn of having a spare tire in your vehicle. Some older models have the spare tire up underneath the vehicle, exposed to the elements. In that case you run the risk of rust and an inability to get the tire down without a blow torch. If you don't check the tire and make sure it is accessible, you never know if it will be available when needed. It has to be tended to. So it goes with faith--the only way to know if will be there in times of need is to bolster it.

I'm writing this on the Solemnity of St. Joseph. If there ever was a man of faith in this world it is Joseph. As Bishop Robert Barron put it today in his gospel reflection - every episode of Joseph's life was a crisis. He found out in a dream his betrothed wife was with child through the Holy Spirit. He had to scramble to find a safe place where Jesus could be born. He then had to flee with his family to a foreign country to save baby Jesus from being killed by Herod. He had to search for three days to find a 12-year-old Jesus in Jerusalem. Through all this he kept his faith, which he had undoubtedly bolstered throughout his life. He had a "spare tire of faith," for as Matthew's gospel points out, he "was a righteous man."

Another man of faith who had a spare tire was Abraham. At the Lord's direction he went into a foreign land and showed great faith in the Lord who promised him that he would be the "father of all nations." (Christians, Jews and Muslims today all regard him as such.) Today's Solemnity readings include St. Paul's reflection on Abraham in his letter to the Romans, noting that it was "not the law that the promise was made to Abraham...but the righteousness that comes from faith." He had his spare tire of faith (or maybe a wagon wheel in his case), when he faced the extreme test of faith in offering his son Isaac in sacrifice.

And in a non-salvation vein, MSU coach Tom Izzo has been preaching faith (secular style) to his players that they could make it to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA basketball tournament which they accomplished as an underdog yesterday. By the time this is read, we will know whether they made it to the Final Four. They are certainly not the most talented team left, but sometimes in sports the best team doesn't always win. Faith in a coach and each other goes a long way. MSU players want to win for the student body, still shook over the campus shootings last month.

Taken together we see that faith is most evident in crisis. We don't know if we have that "spare tire" of faith until it is tested. But we can always bolster it through prayer, Scripture and acts of mercy. Let's not get caught with our spare tire rusted to the bottom of our vehicles in time of need. Have faith.



# Blessing of the Easter Baskets


Saturday, April 8 - 10:30 a.m. (in the church)

The tradition of this Easter Basket of blessed foods is shared at Easter morning breakfast. Be sure to include some Easter candy in the basket and that will be the first Easter candy eaten. Some items to include may be:


