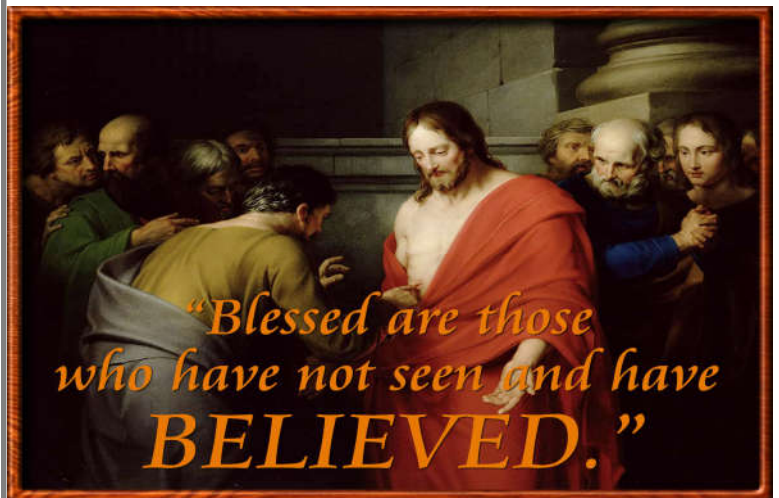
LENTEN ALMSGIVING

WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(and whatever else is on
Deacon Eric's mind)

"If Given a Choice, I Choose Mercy"

"As long as you're alive, you have a season of mercy. But once you're dead, it's your season of justice." (St. Catherine of Siena)

Let's chew on that for a minute. All of us reading this are in a season of mercy. But when our time on earth is done, then we will face God's justice. It will be too late to ask for God's mercy - too late to ask for forgiveness of our sins. It's not like when we get to heaven's gate Jesus asks "Based on your life, would you rather I grant you justice or mercy?" I know what I would choose.

It's no secret that Reconciliation is a vastly under-used sacrament or that Lent draws a lot of the once-a-year penitents to the sacrament. Those of us who say they confess their sins directly to God, should look at today's gospel from John again. Jesus says to his Apostles:

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you (as priests) forgive are forgiven them. Whose sins you retain are retained."

Catholic biblical scholar Brant Pitre has a great take on those words of Christ. Challenging Protestant views that the Lord's statement only gave the Apostles the power to preach well enough to cause people to repent and have their sins forgiven, Pitre says this:

"But that's clearly not what Jesus means here because he doesn't just give the disciples the power to preach, he gives them the power to forgive and to retain someone's sins, which presupposes that somehow a confession of sins would take place so that the apostle would know the sins of the person."

In essence, the answer to the question "Why do I have to confess my sins to a priest?" is a simple one. Pitre says:

"It is because Jesus willed it to be so."

Today is the eighth day in the Octave of Easter, now known as Divine Mercy Sunday, as so-named in April, 2000 by

then-Pope John Paul II. Its origin is in a 1931 revelation to St. Faustina in which Jesus told her:

"Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you... Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death... When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the merciful savior." "I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy."

The mercy of God is endless and we should never believe that we are unworthy of his forgiveness. As I mentioned in my Easter homily, Jesus forgave Mary Magdalene of what St. Gregory identified as the seven deadly sins and then granted her the honor of being the first to see him after his Resurrection. Such mercy is born of love, and, of course, God is love.

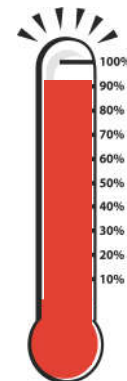
Full time teacher position at Most Holy Trinity School in Fowler.

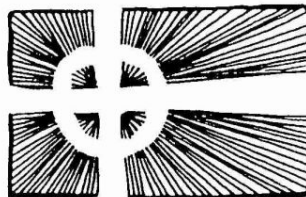
