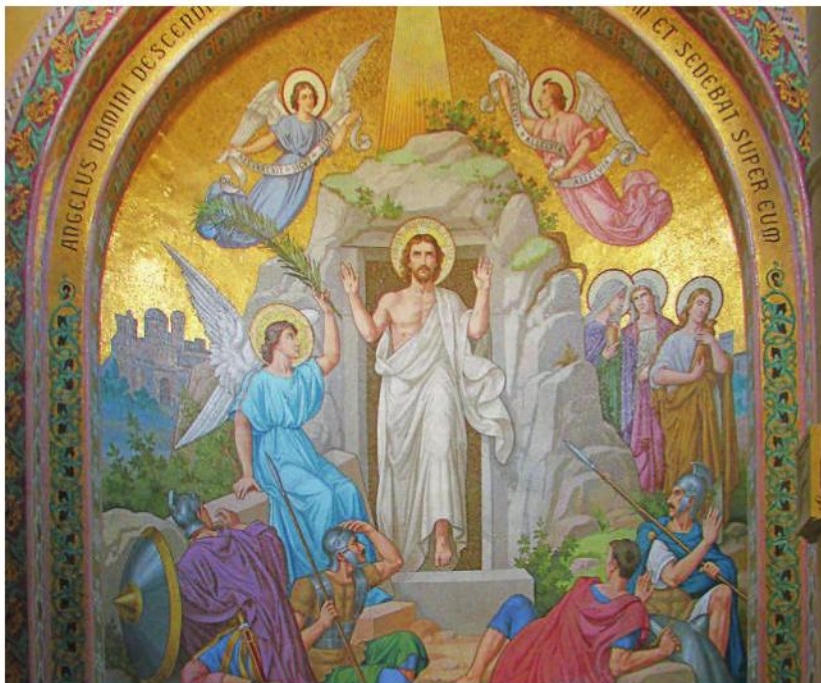

"If Jesus and His Good News

In his Lenten/Easter book entitled *The Pascal Mystery*, Bishop Robert Barron has some interesting thoughts about our faith in relation to the Resurrection of Jesus and Christianity, in general, saying:

"There is something permanently fresh, startling and urgent about the Christian faith. It is not a bland spirituality or generic philosophy, it is news about something amazing and unprecedented -- namely that a carpenter from Nazareth, who declared himself the Son of God, has been raised from the dead."

"The authors of the New Testament" he goes on to say, are not dealing in generalities and abstracts, they are telling the world about a revolution, an earthquake and an emergency. And the Bishop says we need to build our world around Jesus. He then references Pope Francis' "The Joy of the Gospel" (*Evangeli Gaudium*), noting the need for all of us to be spreading the

"Good News of Jesus Christ" and not just rely on the Church to do so:

"He knows that if the Church just leads with its doctrines it will devolve into an intellectual debating society, and that if it leads with its moral teachings, it will appear fussy and puritanical. It should lead today as it did two thousand years ago, with the stunning news that Jesus Christ is Lord, and the joy of that proclamation should be as evident now as it was then."

Two weeks ago, more than 400 people came into the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lansing at the Easter Vigil. They all learned a little about church doctrine and a little about our moral teachings, but all of that would fall by the wayside without the reception of the Resurrected Jesus and the good news he brings with him. We need to help foster their growth by engaging with them and inviting them to parish activities and bible studies that they may grow further in their newfound faith.

The Joy of the Gospel apostolic exhortation was written by Pope Francis shortly after he became pope in 2013, but his words remain true. He saw then what we must also recognize now

is that some of us have turned into (in the Pope's words) "querulous and disillusioned pessimists, 'sourpusses' and whose lives seem like Lent without Easter." OUCH! (And, if you're like me and wonder what "querulous" means, it means "complaining in a whining manner.")

Those are pretty harsh words and I don't know how many of us they describe, but I will acknowledge that our world can make us pessimistic at times. So it's up to us to not forget the message of hope that Jesus brings us through his Resurrection. Easter Sunday was only two weeks ago and our church was overflowing for Masses primarily because of our family members and friends who only come a few times a year. Let's remind them of the heart of our faith -- Jesus died for our sins and opened the gates of heaven for those who believe in him. Let's spread that good news and "quash the querulous."

The Food Box

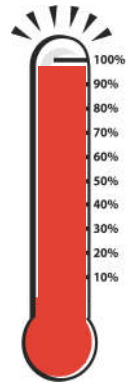
The Food Box donations help families in our community through the Emergency Food Assistance

WHO ARE THESE PEOPLE?

An Introduction to the holy people who have joined our new worship space

St. Vincent DePaul

St. Vincent was born into a poor family in France on April 24, 1581. Educated by Franciscans, Vincent tutored others to raise enough money to attend the University of Toulouse and study theology. Ordained in 1600, he was captured by Barbary pirates while traveling by boat and sold as a slave. When he escaped two years later, he was placed in charge of distributing money to the poor on behalf of the Count of Goigny.

He preached missions, provided relief to the poor, established hospitals, and ministered to convicts; eventually founding the lay group Ladies of Charity to assist him in this work, as well as the Congregation of the Priests of the Mission (commonly referred to as the Vincentians). He also co-founded the Daughters of Charity in 1633.

In France at the time, few priests were properly educated, so St. Vincent became involved in reforming and applying the education and formation of priests. Vincent died in Paris on September 27, 1660. He was canonized on June 16, 1737, by Pope Clement XIII.

Attribute

Our icon of St. Vincent de Paul hangs in the devotional alcove on the south side of the worship space. He is pictured with a scroll bearing his motto "Let all things be done with charity." He was chosen because of the strong ministry of our St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Vincentians in the parish. In art, he appears in the habit of a Franciscan friar, with an infant either in his arms or at his feet, and not unfrequently with a sister of mercy kneeling by his side.

St. Vincent is the patron saint of charitable societies. According to a variety of sources, he is also the patron saint of cabinetmakers, volunteers, hospitals, Madagascar, prisoners, captives, imprisoned people, spiritual help, and the diocese of Reno, Nevada
