When I look at Mothers Day, I feel quite blessed in saying that not only did I have a great Mom, but I have a wife who is a great mother, in addition to three sisters, two daughters and two daughters-in-law who have been, and are continuing to be, wonderful mothers.

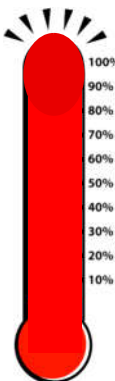


WE DID IT!!
