

#### REFLECTING ON G.K.

It's a good thing I don't have to pay residuals to G. K. Chesterton for using his wisdom in a veiled attempt to advance the appearance that I may have some of my own. Again I'm starting today's column with one of Chesterton's insightful thoughts: "All science, even the divine science, is a sublime detective story. Only it is not set to detect why a man is dead; but why he is alive."

(Now there are two ways I could play this situation. I could pretend that this is a brand new beginning to my column. Or I could "fess up" and admit that my opening paragraph and accompanying Chesterton quote is the same one I used at the end of August 2020. But I happen to know that there are a few former teachers who read this column and recognize what I'll call "self-plagerism." I'm going back to the quote for one simple reason -- because I think it worth a reflection on a recurring basis.)

If we were the detective in the "sublime detective story," where would we start the search for the reason each of us is alive. We don't have the benefit of having Jesus standing next to us to spell it out like he did to Peter in today's gospel. Though there is no "Mission Impossible-like" phone booth mentioned in the gospel from Matthew, Peter's reason for life becomes apparent when Jesus says to him "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church." His mission wasn't impossible, but it most certainly was challenging. More on that in a minute.

Let's flip back the pages on the calendar to the mid-16th century and take a look at some St. Francis de-Sales advice. He said we need to ponder the reason God brought our souls and bodies together at the exact time he did. By doing this, we can reflect on what we may have done right or wrong up to this current moment, thus helping us guide our future thoughts, prayers and actions. What was God's purpose in giving us the parents he gave us, our family and life situations, and so on? The questions build one on top

of another for us to contemplate and hopefully guide us to our purpose going forward from whatever point in life we reside at the moment.

One morning Peter woke up as one of a group of 12 selected men following Jesus. By the time he closed the flap on his tent that night he knew he had a huge task lying in front of him for the rest of his life. He, of course, was flawed. He sinned, as we all do. He even denied Jesus three times. But he sought forgiveness and continued forward. As we know from the gospels and Acts of the Apostles this uneducated fisherman was dogged in fulfilling his mission. The Church Jesus built stands because of it. It will continue to stand if we are just as dogged in fulfilling our mission. Let's start by donning our detective hats and taking a look inside -- and asking "Why?"




