

Never Get Weary

Never get weary. It seems like an impossibility, doesn't it? Even the most energetic of people get weary. Parents know that little ones are usually full of energy (often considerably more than Mom and Dad) but eventually their EverReady batteries run low. They'll be recharged by 6:00 a.m., but they do need their rest, as we all do.

Actually, when placed in context with my point of the day, "never get weary" proves to be difficult, but not impossible. What I am referring to is a verse from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians in which he urges Christians to "Never grow weary of doing what is right, brothers." (2 Thes 3:13) This came up recently in my Liturgy of the Hours Morning Prayer, and though it is a verse that I've read often it really struck me this week as being quite appropriate for the times we live in.

National and state legislatures across the country are passing laws making it harder and harder for Christians in general, and Catholics more specifically, to take our religion outside the church walls. Catholic hospitals and schools are extremely vulnerable to mandates and judicial decisions that run counter to Catholic teaching. Those are keeping the courts busy and it is why St. Joe's is part of a lawsuit to protect churches from similar mandates that would affect what the Church has been teaching from its beginnings.

The situation for St. Paul with the Thessalonians differed from ours. He faced a Christian segment that had just stopped working, thinking the Second Coming of Jesus was imminent, thus not only disrupting the way of life in Thessalonica, but hindering the spread of the faith. In his time, as in ours, however, the message is the same -- keep persevering and never grow weary of doing what is right.

OTHER NEWS AND VIEWS: For those who have some interest in "The Chosen" video series, but do not have TV streaming services like Netflix and or a DVD Blu-Ray player, you can now view the series TV on the CW channel. You will not be able to binge watch it like those who have access to the other services, but you can watch it like a regular weekly series. It is available over the air on digital channel 53.2. If you have

Spectrum cable it's on channel 5 and on AT& T U-Verse channel 54. "The Chosen" airs at 8:00 p.m. every Sunday night. They are only a couple episodes into season one, so you should be able to pick up the characters in short order. And for those anxiously awaiting season four's release, note that filming has been completed. No definitive date has yet been released for starting the next season.

ST. JOSEPH NEWS: This has been in the bulletin already, but I would like to give a personal promo for an upcoming Book Club discussion moderated by our RCIA director Amanda Grigar. Amanda is encouraging people to read "The Screwtape Letters" by C. S. Lewis. It is a wonderfully-crafted satirical look at how the devil looks to draw us away from God. A book club can't exist without members, so I highly encourage joining Amanda in dissecting this book, which though short, conjures up plenty of questions and discussion items.


An Introduction to the holy people who have joined our new worship space

SAINT JUAN DIEGO

Juan Diego was born in 1474 and was known by the name Cuauhtlatoatzin ("the talking eagle"). He and his wife were baptized when he was 50 years old. On December 9, 1531 Juan Diego was walking to Mass when the Virgin Mary appeared to him, on Tepeyac Hill (which is now part of Mexico City, Mexico). The Blessed Mother asked Juan to go to the bishop and request that a shrine be built on that spot. The bishop didn't believe him, so Juan returned to the hill. Mary told Juan to climb a hill and pick some flowers, where he found roses growing despite it being winter. He took the roses to the bishop as proof of the vision, and when he opened his tilma (cloak) the roses fell out, and an image of Mary was impressed on the tilma.

He was canonized on July 31, 2002 by Pope John Paul II and is the first Roman Catholic indigenous saint of the Americas.

In art, Saint Juan Diego is pictured with his Tilma and the roses and the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, as does our of St. Juan Diego, which is in the devotional alcove on the south side of the worship space. He was chosen for our parish not just because he is from North America, but also because he is inseparable from Our Lady of Guadalupe, to which this parish has a long devotion
