

# Hope will lead the way

We should hope because we share in Jesus' Resurrection. (1 Thes 4:13-14)

We should hope because it leads to eternal life with God. (Eph 1:18)  $% \left( \frac{1}{2}\right) =0$ 

We should hope because it will not disappoint. (Rom 5:3-5)

With these scriptural thoughts in mind, I encourage all those who are grieving the loss of a loved one to attend the upcoming "Grieving with Great HOPE" workshop co-sponsored by the St. Joseph and St. Jude's grief ministry teams. "Hope" is the focus of the event to be held at St. Jude's Church on October 6th and 7th.

I'm aware that attending such a workshop can be a very daunting situation for many, but the structure of the event lends itself into an easing-into the weekend, which begins Friday evening with a two-hour spiritual service. Deacon Kevin Orth of St. Jude's and I will give presentations and the two weekend leaders --John and Sandy O'Shaughnessy -- will present their grief stories. We'll then have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, then a very moving candlelight ceremony which includes an individual blessing from the deacons for each of the participants.

Saturday provides an opportunity for John and Sandy to help through large group and small group education. Whereas Friday is about spirituality and prayerfulness in asking the Lord to help us find hope, Saturday will be about understanding grief and the offering of practical tools to help us work through grief. John is a Certified Grief Counselor. Sandy has a Masters degree in Pastoral Ministry with an emphasis in bereavement. Each lost a spouse in a previous marriage and together they formed Good Mourning Ministry more than a decade ago. Together they are masterful educators in grief -- understanding it and working through it.

I have heard, albeit second-hand, that some in our community believe this to be a day of tears and crying over our losses. There most certainly will be some tears, but first and foremost this weekend is about bringing hope into lives currently dominated by despair, about understanding the difference between grief and mourning and about using some tools to help us as we work through our mourning.

The title "Good Mourning Ministry" actually has a double meaning -- not only the mourning linked with grief but "morning" which brings to us the image of a new day, with sunlight allowing us to see something we could not see at night. Which then brings to mind the opening of John's gospel when the evangelist describes Jesus as the Word: "In him was life, and life was the **light** of men. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it." (Jn 1:4-5)

Registration for Grieving with great HOPE is still open via <u>goodmounrning-</u><u>ministry.net</u> or call (517) 449-2928. The cost of the workshop is a very reasonable ten dollars. So, for those who are stuck in the darkness while mourning the loss of a loved one, join us on October 6th-7th and let the light of Christ and hope back into your lives.





## Witness to Hope Update

We're making progress on completing our last two Witness to Hope projects!

- **Refurbishing the organ** – As of this writing, we're waiting for the Diocese to approve our request to refurbish the church organ. The work would be split into two phases; the first will happen as soon as we get our approval and the second between Christmas and Easter.

- **New windows in the north addition of the school –** This job is currently out for bids from contractors with plans for the work to be done in the summer of 2024.

Again, we thank all of our parishioners who supported Witness to Hope. If you were unable to fulfill your pledge during the campaign or didn't get a chance to make a pledge, you are welcome to make donations to our parish's Building Fund.




Architect's rendering of new windows in the north wing of the school.

More school window news: Our architect has also drawn up plans to replace the windows in the south wing of the school. The current windows are single-pane which lets in a lot of heat during the warm months and a lot of cold in the winter months. The new windows would be much more energy efficient and will make the classrooms more comfortable. The south wing windows are also in the bidding documents that contractors are working with. More info to come in the next month.

In the meantime, the extended window project will deplete our savings account. Unless we receive an unexpected windfall, we'll need to raise a portion of the cost for new windows. We welcome all donations to the Building Fund to help us make this happen.
