

A Lament for the Ages
"You duped me, O Lord
And I let myself be duped;
You were too strong for me,
And you triumphed.
All the day I am an object of
laughter;

Everyone mocks me."

Ouch! Jeremiah really lays it on Our Lord in today's first reading. After years of prophesying for God, Jeremiah called out in frustration, because not only were the Israelite leaders of the time not heeding his warnings from the Lord for their behavior, he had been locked in the stocks -- a subject of public ridicule.

Jeremiah's lamentation came shortly after his time in the stocks, whereby he lashed out at the chief priest Pashur. He prophesied that Pashur and his family would be taken away into exile after the Babylonians capture Jerusalem and ultimately destroy the temple. In other words, he got God's message out one more time, then emotionally drained, fell into today's lament. It carries much the same tone as Jesus' lament in the form of the 22nd Psalm, which begins with the words "My God, My God, Why have you abandoned me?"

One of the great aspects of learning more about Scripture is that we can sometimes read a passage and say "Wow, I can relate to that." or "People and their emotions really haven't changed much over the last three thousand years." And so it is here, because many of us undoubtedly have had moments in our lives where we got fed up with God. We have felt that we have tried hard to live the Christian life, yet the Lord hasn't come through when we've most hoped - when we just don't want to hear one

more time "Only God knows the big picture."

The word "duped" is a really strong word and I don't know that I would ever use in my prayerful lament, but I can see how others might. I think that is probably not the worst word that has been aimed at God and I'm sure he can handle it because he understands human emotion. The important part of today's lament as well as that of Psalm 22, is that the lamenter works through his hurt. Jeremiah says that as soon as I say that I "will speak in his name no more" there is a burning in his heart to continue, like Rocky continually getting up off the mat against Apollo Creed. And in Psalm 22 which biblical scholars believe Jesus prayed silently after the opening vocal verse, ends with the psalmist calling for praise to the Lord.



The envelopes you receive when registering will now play an important role in the reception of the sacraments. (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Godparents, and Marriage) in the parish. We're asking all parishioners to get into the habit of using your envelopes in the weekly collection. Even if you give online or don't have anything to put in the envelope, please submit an empty envelope. It will help us know how many registered parishioners attend a given Mass and it will also come in handing for determining if a person, presenting themselves for a sacrament, is attending Mass regularly as is required.


