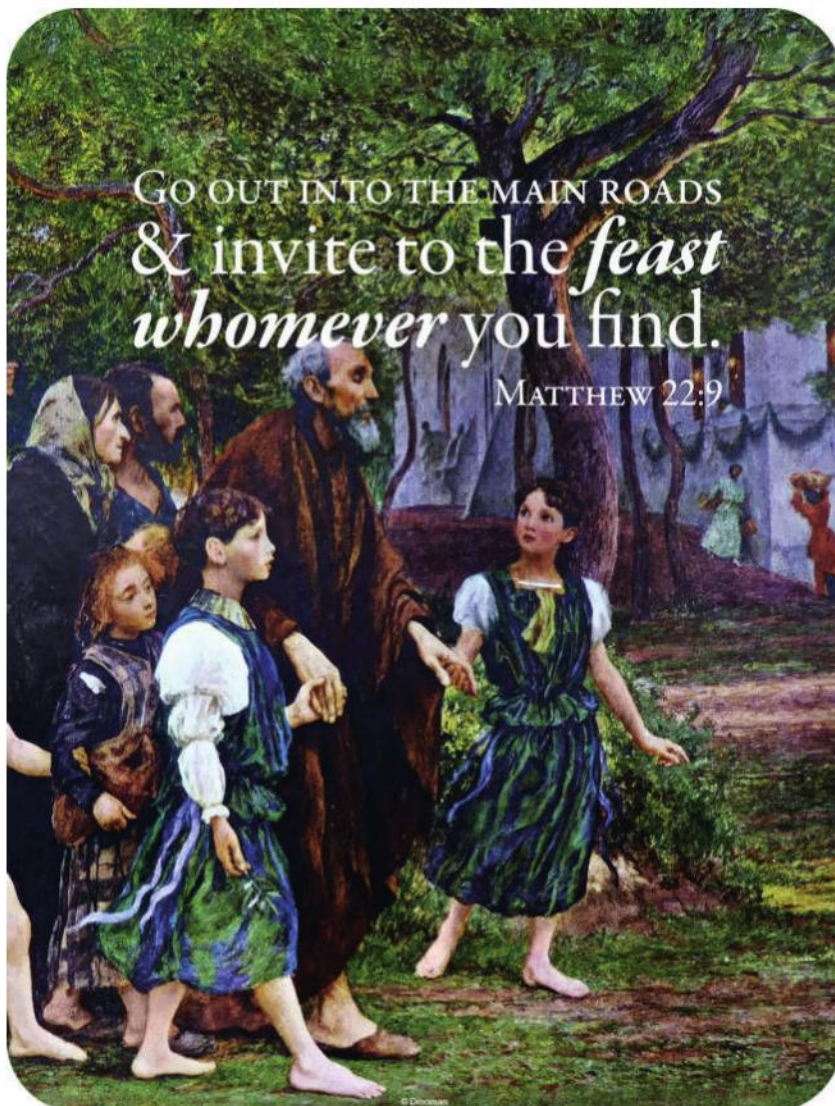

Trying to Make Sense of It All

There are a lot of thoughts "bangin' around in the ol' noggin" right now, so let's give it a go and see where we end up. I think we'll start on the most positive note and that is a quote I came across this weekend from St. John Henry Newman:

"The great power of the Rosary lies in this, that it makes the Creed into a prayer. Of course the Creed is in some sense a prayer and a great act of homage to God; But the Rosary gives us the great truths of Christ's life and death to meditate upon, and brings them nearer to our hearts."

October is the month of the rosary in the Catholic Church. We celebrated the Feast of the Holy Rosary a week ago and this past Friday our parish community offered up a day of prayer in the church with a rosary and divine mercy chaplet at the top of each hour. On that Feast of the Holy Rosary, we lost a man who loved the rosary and who led the Tuesday night rosary and Perpetual Heart devotions at St Joe's for many years. Joe Caudy, with whom I've had

many a fruitful conversation, died just short of his 94th birthday. It seems fitting that a man so dedicated to Our Blessed Mother should be called home by Jesus on one of her feast days. One line in his obituary summed him up: "He was funny, witty, always smiling, friendly to all and loved by many." He was well-loved because he loved well. Rest in peace, my friend.

Also on that day, there was sad news on a global scale with the terrorist attacks on Israel by the group known as Hamas. I try to keep politics out of this column, so I'll limit my words here. The atrocities beyond the scope of the natural horrors of war that have been reported so far are sickening. And the Israeli response this week will likely be equally brutal. It is extremely sad and demands prayer for the people who live in or adjacent to the Promised Land of Canaan. God made this promise to Abraham who is regarded as the father, not only of Christians, but Muslims and Jews as well. You wouldn't know it by how we people of God treat each other.

In yesterday's readings (Oct. 8) we had another in a series of gospel selections about vineyards to which Bishop Robert Barron had this reflection: "The fertile vineyard stands

for Israel, his chosen people. But it could be broadened out to include the world. What do we learn from this beautiful image? That God has made for his people a place where they can find rest, enjoyment, and good work." And the reading from St. Paul that day:

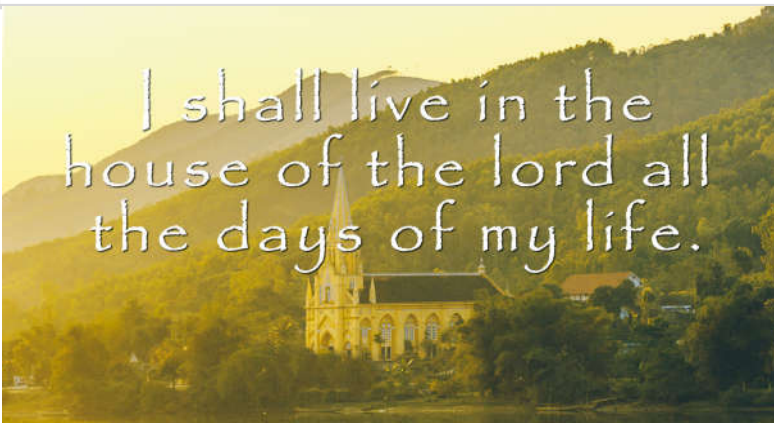
Brothers and sisters: Have no anxiety at all, but in everything...
make your requests known to God.
Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

And as a bonus, let's consider the fact that today (Oct. 9) the gospel story of the day is that of the Good Samaritan -- the story of a Samaritan man who helped a beaten Jew along a path. Did I happen to mention that Jews hated Samaritans?

How do the Scriptural passages and current combat situation in Israel make sense? If you know, stop by my house and I'll give you the keys to this column for you are much wiser than I. In the meantime, I'll be working the beads.

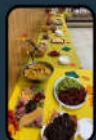

- It allows us to seek your input and feedback.
- It allows you to formally support the parish financially, since envelopes will be issued to you for your use.
- We can start a sacramental record for you.
- Finally, registering can also help you have a greater sense of belonging to and ownership of the parish.


Please note:

The **envelopes** you receive when registering **will now play an important role in the reception of the sacraments.** (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage) in the parish. We're asking all parishioners to get into the habit of using your envelopes in the weekly collection. Even if you give online or don't have anything to put in the envelope, please submit an empty envelope. It will help us know how many registered parishioners attend a given Mass and it will also come in handing for determining if a person, presenting themselves for a sacrament, is attending Mass regularly as is required.
