



From Presents to Presence

Well, the Christmas season is officially over. For many of us it ended January Second, for others it ends with the kids going back to school, but on the Church calendar the season ends today on Epiphany. As the magi hit the road (by the back route) they left behind their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh with the baby Jesus, thus ending our snow-less Christmas season. It's back to normal for us.

During the Christmas season, like the magi, we too went through a ritual of giving presents. Though some of us may have given a gift of gold to a loved one, as did the magi, I doubt that any of us gave or received any frankincense or myrrh. Our gift-giving is in honor of Jesus' birthday, remembering God's gift to us all. The Father's gift of his Son was one never to be topped, as Jesus' birth was the turning point in salvation history.

Our Christmas celebrations are over however, so now it's time to turn our thoughts from "presents" to "Presence," as in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. We are in the midst of a Eucharistic Revival in the Church, which will peak in mid-July in the United States with the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. It's a five-day event to be held at Lucas Oil Stadium and it is open to all Catholics. Single day passes start at 49 dollars, with kids 12 and under free. There are week-

end and full event passes available

as well.

The parish continues to present opportunities for us to grow in our understanding of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. A few months ago, St. Joe's sponsored a display of all Eucharistic miracles and this month we will explore the sacrament of the Eucharist in a three-part series entitled "Presence," based on the "Formed" video series of the same name. These sessions, moderated by St. Joe Christian Initiation director Amanda Grigar, will explore not only Catholic beliefs, but their Scriptural foundations as well.

No matter where we are in our spiritual journey, this series can enhance us. It will not only help us grow in our faith, but will give us the tools to defend our beliefs in conversation with people, Catholic or not, who don't believe or understand the concept of transubstantiation, whereby simple bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ when consecrated at a Catholic Mass. They are not symbols.

When the Church says Real Presence, it is saying that when we receive the Eucharist at Mass we receive Jesus - Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. It is considered by the Church as "the source and summit of the Christian life." This series explains how Vatican II arrived at that definition. Please consider joining us on January 18 th and 25 th and February First. It will not only help us in understanding our faith better it will be a great prep for Lent.



Are you already using Online Giving? Sometimes we set up automatic systems and forget to check them to make sure everything is current. Please take a few minutes to make sure that your donation amount is correct and that your credit card or bank card hasn't expired.

IRA Required Minimum Distributions: If you're 72 years or older, donating your IRA required minimum distribution to the parish can be a way to pay less taxes. Contact your investment advisor and the parish office to make a direct transfer so that the distribution doesn't have to be claimed as income.

Donate stocks, bonds, or mutual funds: To avoid capital gains tax on appreciated securities, consider transferring them to St. Joe's as your donation. Contact your investment advisor and the parish office to make this transfer.

Remembering the Parish

All gifts are welcome, and we ask that you prayerfully consider whether a portion of your estate should be used to continue the ministries of the parish. 




