Time to Look Inside

Well it's that time of year again. It's time to focus less on what's happening around us and take a snapshot of our inner life. It's time to look inside and ask ourselves some tough questions. It's time for Lent -- a time to take a serious look at our souls. That look, however, will be worthless without a **commitment to repentance**. And by repentance I don't just mean saying a prayer asking for God's forgiveness, but a sincere confession and commitment to change the behaviors that led to the sins we confessed. We need to change for the better.

We never know when our time will come. And sometimes deaths come in bunches. I had four recently in the span of about ten days in my personal and diaconal life. I just read about a former professional basketball player who broadcast a game last weekend and

died unexpectedly the next morning. Lent is all about preparing for our end and removing sinful stains on our soul, for we need to be pure before we can enter our heavenly home. We need to enter Lent with the disposition of the leper in today's gospel who said to Jesus, "If you wish, make me clean."

Jesus responded to the leper as he had hoped: "I do will it. Be made clean" was the Lord's response. The leper was immediately cleansed. This is a fitting conclusion to today's readings. Remember our first reading which described how the visible sores of leprosy made the victims unclean -- ostracized from the community. That meant they could not worship God in the temple. As such, Jesus tells the cleansed leper in our gospel selection to first show himself to the priest and offer sacrifice, allowing for admittance to the temple and public worship of God.

Through the sacrament of reconciliation we, too, can be made clean. Jesus does will it. Though we do not carry the visible signs of leprosy when we sin, God most

certainly sees them on our souls. Our sins are like the leper's sores of our souls, separating us from the one who gave us physical life and who offers us eternal life. But in our case, it is our actions that are responsible for these blemishes on our souls. The lepers did not bring on their own disease.

On Ash Wednesday we will hear the gospel account from Matthew that encourages us to follow the three-pronged approach to Lent of prayer, fasting and alms-giving, and to do so in true humility. We are not to draw attention to ourselves by our actions. Our goal is not to present a "woe is me" front or a "look at me" attitude. The goal is to be a better person at the end of Lent than at the beginning, to have a clean soul, to be a better giver and become a prayer warrior. But first we have to take the very first step, taking the time to look inside.

Rite of Sending, Rite of Election, and the Call to Continuing Conversion

On the first Sunday of Lent (February 18), those from our parish preparing to enter into full Communion with the Catholic Church will be sent to the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion. In the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion, "the Church makes its 'election' of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part...in the sacraments of initiation" (*Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults [RCIA]*, 119). In addition, those baptized Christians who seek to "complete their Christian formation and become fully integrated into the community..." (*RCIA*, 410) come before the bishop who, on behalf of the Church, officially recognizes their "desire to have a place at Christ's Eucharistic table" (*RCIA*, 454). The Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion stands not only as ratification of the catechumens' and candidates' readiness for the sacraments but as a witness to everyone's need and longing for communion with our God and the Church's call to bring them into the fold.

At our 10:00 AM Mass on Sunday, February 18, the parish community will express its approval of those planning to join the Church at Easter, and send them forth with care and support to participate in the Rite of Election or Call to Continuing Conversion with Bishop Boyea.


