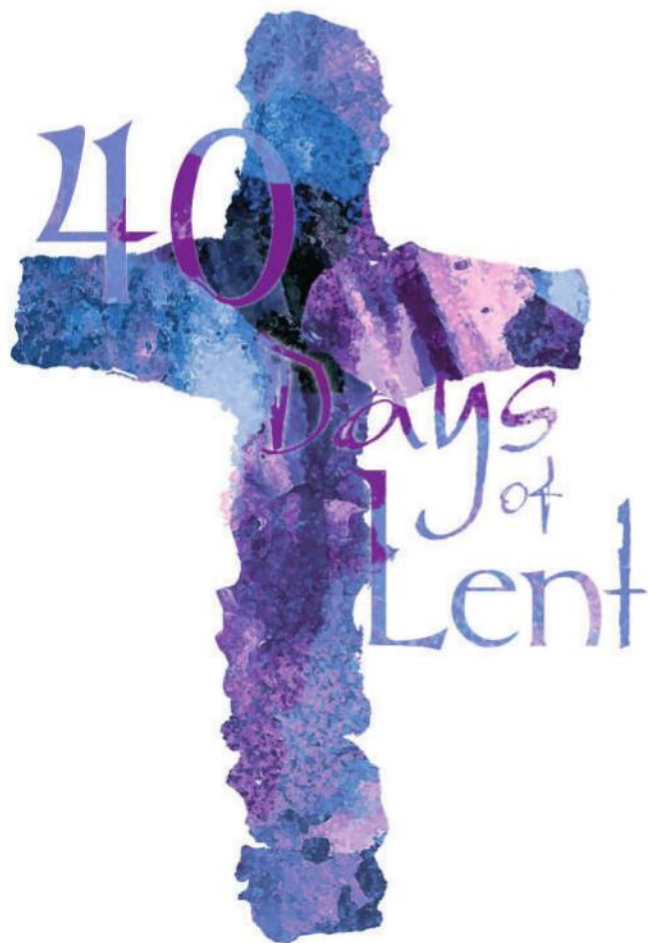

What Does Faith Mean to Us?

(A quick shout out to the group of parishioners who recently donated a Saturday morning to packing over 60 thousand dry meals for the poor in developing countries. In the Knights of Columbus-sponsored event, about 100 people gathered at Lansing Catholic to put together the meals of dried veggies, ground soy, black beans and rice. I hesitate to try to name everyone from St. Joe's lest I miss someone, but thanks go out to Mike, Kim, Tom, Tera, Mason, Steve and Mary Beth and anyone else I may have missed. God bless you.)

A few weeks ago this column focused on G. K. Chesterton look at forgiveness and the three theological virtues of faith, hope and love. Today, while putting together some thoughts about this column I came across a gospel reflection

from noted Catholic scholar and writer Bishop Robert Barron who focused on the virtue of faith:

Faith is an attitude of trust in the presence of God. Faith is openness to what God will reveal, do, and invite. It should be obvious that in dealing with the infinite, all-powerful person who is God, we are never in control.

Wow! Think of that closing statement for a few seconds: "in dealing with the infinite, all powerful person who is God, we are never in control." This statement forces us to look at our level of humility, or perhaps our lack of it. This may be a great focal point of prayer for some of us this Lent. Do we run our lives under the guise that we control them or are we understanding that our lives run best when we stay out of God's way? The bishop says:

This is why we say that faith goes beyond reason. If we can figure it out, calculate precisely, predict with complete accuracy, we're in charge—and by definition, we are not dealing with a

person. Would you use any of those descriptors in talking about your relationship with your husband, wife, or best friend? Instead, you enter into an ever-increasing rapport of trust with such people.

In life, we learn to trust those people whom we have come to know and love over long periods of time. We have faith in them. It's only natural then to have ultimate faith in the one who has ultimate control. If we are struggling with this, Lent is the perfect time to talk to God about it.

(For those who are looking for a singular prayer focus this Lent, here, once again, is Chesterton's look at the theological virtues: "To love means loving the unlovable. To forgive means pardoning the unpardonable. Faith means believing the unbelievable. Hope means hoping when everything seems hopeless". Pick one and pray.)

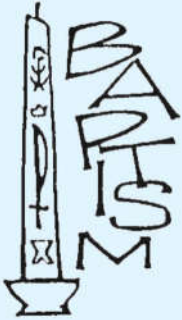

From Fr. Mike:

The Importance of Mass

If I've been away from Mass for a long time, or even once, can't I just start over, and begin going to Mass again and start receiving Holy Communion?

Start coming to Mass right away, but as in the case of any other mortal sin, ask God's forgiveness immediately, but you must have all your mortal sins forgiven in the sacrament of Penance before you resume receiving Holy Communion again. Pope John Paul II wrote in *Dominicae cenae*, 24 February 1980, "But we must always take care that this great meeting with Christ in the Eucharist does not become a mere habit, and that we do not receive Him unworthily, that is to say, in the state of mortal sin. The practice of the virtue of penance and the Sacrament of Penance are essential for sustaining in us the continually deepening that spirit of veneration which man owes to God Himself, and to His love so marvelously revealed."


