

Woo-Hoo! Yippee!! Hallelujah!!! It has arrived. "What has arrived?" you may ask. Well, this has arrived. What you are reading has arrived. This column has reached the ripe old age of 500. And to fulfill the promise I made at the end of column 400, I feel obligated to ask the question "500, what does it mean?"
