### Answers

Last week we dealt with questions, this week we are dealing with answers -- but not to the thousand million questions posed last week. We'll look today at the answers for the questions "Are we going to do anything more with "The Chosen" series? Who is Richard Budd and is he any relation to Billy Budd? And finally "What is the best way for a Catholic man from St. Joe's to spend a winter Saturday in March?"

I'm going to try something a little different regarding "The Chosen". In anticipation of the release of the Season Four app, I thought we could take a poll of our favorite episodes of the first three seasons and do a mini-marathon of the top two episodes from each season. This will provide an opportunity to re -live our favorite scenes for those who have attended previous group viewings of "The Chosen". If necessary, you can vote by identifying key plot line (i.e. Wedding Feast). Votes will be accepted by noon on Monday, March 11th . In case of tie, I will choose. The minimarathon will then run as follows: Season One, Monday Mar. 11th, Season Two, Wednesday Mar. 13th and Season Three, Thursday March 14th . I will start Season Four viewing on Thursday nights shortly after the episodes become available on the app. That date has not yet been released. As regular watchers know, we gain perspective when we see the episodes more than once, so even those who have viewed Season Four in the theaters are encouraged to join us for individual showings.

Relative to my second question, the answer is "No, Richard Budd is not related to Billy Budd." For starters, Richard Budd is a real person, heading the diocesan office of Marriage and Family Life, while Billy Budd is a fictional character created by "Moby Dick" author Herman Melville. I encourage all adults, especially parMARCH 3, 2024

ents, to attend a talk Richard Budd will be giving this Wednesday at St. Joe's about how our homes and families form a domestic church. Budd will help us learn how to transfer our faith to our children and grandchildren. Studies clearly show that homes that foster the faith result in children maintaining the Catholic faith through the high school years and result in stronger marriages as we carry our beliefs into adulthood. He will be speaking in the church at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday evening.

Finally, I would like to encourage the men of the parish to attend the Catholic Men's Conference sponsored by the diocese on Saturday, March 16th . It's a great opportunity to refocus on our faith in the middle of Lent. In addition to great speakers, there will be confession opportunities and a Mass said by Bishop Boyea. Register at **acceptthechallenge.org.** Those wishing to avoid driving can take a bus out of St. Jude's for only 25 dollars. Take a day to share your faith with Catholic men.

Let's not waste these faith opportunities to get closer to God this Lent.
