Agree or Disagree?

We must love them both -those whose opinions we share, and whose opinions we reject-for both have labored in the search for truth, and both have helped us in finding it.

These are the words of Saint Thomas Aquinas, thought by many to be among the greatest Catholic thinkers, if not the greatest. Aquinas was known to be very pragmatic with a great scientific mind. Though those words may have been quite true in the 13th century when he wrote them, they appear to be pie-in-the-sky thoughts when placed in our society.

Everywhere we look and listen nowadays, we are faced with somebody's opinion -- whether we are seeking it or not. Debate in search of the truth has its roots in the orations of the great Greek philosophers Plato, Socrates and Aristotle. Aquinas, for example, based much of his Catholic writings on Aristotelian philosophy. The great minds debated, but when they were done talking, they listened. Some then accepted what others had said and modified their positions accordingly. This is to be expected when all parties are seeking the truth. When they find it they accept it, even if it's not what they had thought previously. Unfortunately, opinion seems to bury truth today.

Perhaps, my own opinion is clouded by the fact that my search for the ultimate truth ended with the realization that Jesus is the Truth -- beginning and ending right there. Aquinas was in a philosophical world with dozens of voices. The plethora of philosophers continued through the Protestant Reformation, the Enlightenment and numerous revolutions, including our own. It seems this search will be ongoing unless the whole world accepts Jesus.

Far be it from me, of course, to argue against Aquinas. He lived 800 years ago and quite likely he might phrase his thoughts a bit differently if he were living in the 21st - century America. In any century, I feel comfortable in saying God granted him more Wisdom than he granted me, but, of course, God's plan for each of us is different. There's no question he would have found a worthy opponent to debate in search of truths in any century.

Opinion runs rampant in our world. It's hard, even in watching local news, to separate fact from opinion. As a person who enjoys playing around with words, I realize how easy it is to manipulate thought by inserting a particular slant into a sentence that affects perspective. Much of our world now wants to put us in a box, separating those who believe in science from those who have faith. Aguinas wrote that we don't have to be separated, that reason (science) and faith are compatible. It's time we all realize that and bring this world together again.



The Word of God is Proclaimed

What to do with your old and unwanted Religious items

A sacramental is a sacred sign that bears resemblance to the sacraments. Sacramentals include religious articles such as scapulars, blessed holy cards, crucifixes, statues, Bibles, missals, Lectionaries, holy water and oils, liturgical vestments, and altar cloths. But what are you to do with them when they break, become tattered and worn out? You can't just discard them. They're almost like people, sacred. They need to be treated properly, even at the end.

The basic rule for the disposal of these items is to burn or to bury them. During the 1800s the Church issued several decisions concerning the this issue. Here are a few examples: A chalice which becomes "unserviceable" is not to be sold but must be used for some other sacred purpose or melted. Vestments, altar cloths, and linens must be destroyed. Polluted or excess holy water must be poured into the ground. Palms are to be burned, and the ashes then used for distribution on Ash Wednesday or returned to the ground. A broken rosary or religious statue normally would be buried. In all, the underlying idea is that when has been dedicated to God should be returned to God. Never should one just "throw out" what has been blessed and dedicated to God.

With the exception of rosaries which can be placed on the rosary rack, please do not bring your unwanted items to the parish nor leave them in the back of the church. I understand the idea of leaving those things for someone else to pick up and use. However, that is not happening, and items just continue to pile up. After a while this becomes a problem because it makes the church look unkept. If you don't have a fire pit to burn the items or have a yard in which to buy them, then ask a neighbor or relative if they can help you dispose of those items. This is precisely what we do with items that are left in the church.
