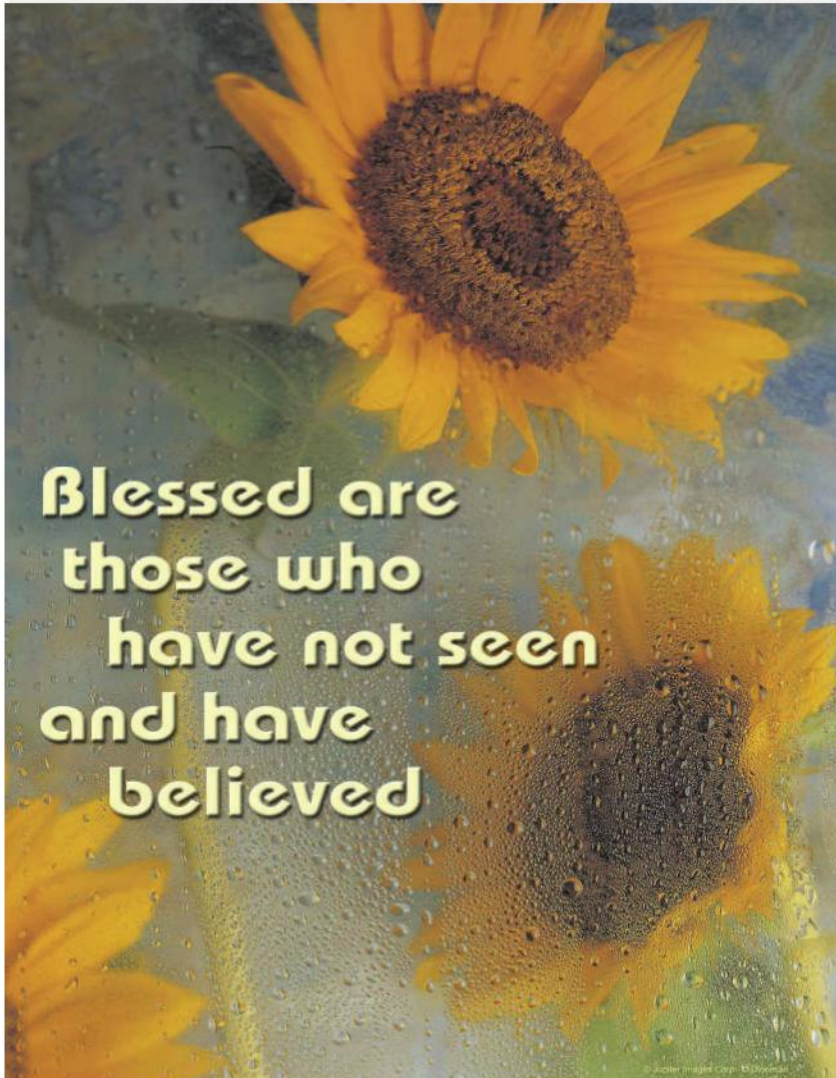

Spiritual Pruning

I am not a horticulturist, nor do I play one on TV, but since I do know how to look up information on the internet I recently found out that now is a great time to prune plants and shrubs. Late March and April are identified by the sources I looked up as the best time to prepare plants and shrubs for the growing season. That's as far as I'm going to take you, however, if you want to know if different plants, shrubs and trees need more or less pruning than others, you probably should ask someone who knows what he or she is talking about. I researched just enough to get this first paragraph completed. This column actually has nothing to do with plants or shrubs. The pruning I will discuss today involves pruning in our spiritual lives.

I can't even take the credit for that. The idea of spiritual pruning

comes all the way from Ecuador, courtesy of Anna Biewer -- parish secretary-turned-missionary. I suspect many of you received the same newsletter from her that I am referencing. The letter talks about how she is trying to adapt to the jungle culture, mastering Spanish, preparing for marriage and trying to let God prune her life so that her gifts might bloom in ways heretofore unknown. Anna realizes that for maximum spiritual growth we need to let God prune our lives for us to grow.

God, of course, is a master gardener, having significant experience with some well-known gardens. His pruning is not limited to some specific time of the year, but since we are in a traditionally good month for pruning, why not now for some spiritual pruning as well. I think a good place to start is analyzing the relative success or disappointment in meeting our Lenten goals. If our plan was to increase our spiritual reading during Lent and we failed because we fell asleep in the chair in which we usually watch TV (and sometimes fall asleep),

maybe we need to prune the chair and not the spiritual reading. Maybe the Lord can reach us if we find a room or a chair in which we only sit to pray or do spiritual reading.

Analyzing our prayer life can lead to another way we can prune. Maybe we feel we don't get anything out of our evening prayer. Again, assist the Lord in his pruning by changing the prayer selection. We may be blazing through our prayers so quickly that we don't even realize what words we are saying. Try slowing down, try a different set of prayers, try a new daily devotional -- maybe kneel to say prayers instead of sitting or laying down. All of these suggestions are a form of pruning something that was once successful in our spiritual life, allowing for new growth. God can then take up our efforts and prune us so that we may become closer to him. Let's let the master gardener help us to bloom in ways we never imagined.

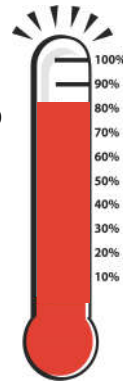
