(and whatever else is on Deacon Eric's mind)

Where Are the Boys? I was an interested observer last week at the State Finals of the Michigan Right to Life Oratory Contest and as the wonderful high-school speakers presented their speeches a question came to mind: "Where are the boys?" In the end there were 18 speakers from around the state and only three of them were boys -a 5:1 ratio of girls to boys. Again, I wondered why that ratio was so lopsided.

Those who participated were from all over the state -- each having won a county or tri-county RTL competition. As a group, they tackled difficult adult-level topics like abortion, euthanasia and infanticide and they did it well. Some were a little better than others in presentation or projection and other specific categories that judges use in order to decide who the top three speakers were. But all showed a characteristic that is lacking in society as a whole -- COURAGE. With courage to put ourselves out there, exposing ourselves and our beliefs, we overcome our fears. To put themselves out in

public as being pro-life in a culture that runs counter to that showed great courage by these teenagers and gives hope to those of us worried about the state of society.

But I still come back to question of why so few boys participated. In many instances it would have been easy money for them, with most local RTL affiliates awarding \$100 for the winners for a six-minute speech. I don't think it's a fear of competition because great numbers of high school boys participate in sports. I wonder if parents just don't encourage boys enough in other parts of life. Perhaps boys are just taking their cues from their fathers who encourage them to participate in sports but not in speech contests or becoming altar servers. Courage, obviously, is the root of encourage. Maybe us dads as a whole need to help our boys by encouraging them in wider areas of life. As adults, they are much more likely to need courage in expressing their beliefs than in hitting a free throw in a professional basketball game.

REMINDER: Don't forget about our three-night "'Draw Near,' Eucharistic Mission" this week presented by Fr. Matthew Bonk. Fr. Matthew has great experience in preaching missions and retreats throughout the country and promises us some great insights into the Eucharist and the deep mysteries of the Blessed Sacrament. The mission will start at 7:00 p.m. Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, with his final talk being a homily at Tuesday evening Mass. Fr. Matthew will also join us for our neighborhood procession of the Eucharist after 12:00 Mass. Let's show up "en masse" after Noon Mass and show the city of St. Johns our love for the Eucharist.

NOTE: In an attempt to get young people to understand and think about vocations at an earlier age, a small team of parishioners got together to produce a couple short videos about vocations. with St. Joseph School students sharing their talents both on-screen and offscreen.
