So You Think You Know Your Faith

Sometimes, us cradle Catholics get pretty comfortable in our faith journey, perhaps thinking we know more than we really do about Catholicism -especially those of us who are over the age of 50. But the harsh reality is that, unless we have dived into the teachings of our faith, we have only scratched the surface. Though many of us can say we've been "around the block" a few times and have picked up substantial knowledge of the Church and its teachings, the hard truth is that a vast majority of Catholics, not just St. Joe parishioners, haven't had any formal Catholic instruction since we received the sacrament of Confirmation as teenagers.

It is with that in mind, that an adult faith formation team has been formed here at St. Joe's. (Adult Faith Director Amanda Grigar spoke about it before Masses last month.) It's pur-

pose is to generate ideas and attractive programs to encourage adult parishioners at all age levels to find new ways to explore the depths of our faith. We've had bible study groups here for decades and they will continue. There's a group of die-hard "The Chosen" fans who can't help but watch each episode over and over again. But they need to watch it within a group in order to discuss the intricacies of each episode, so we provide a forum for that to happen. And this too will continue -- the object of the adult faith formation team is not to replace what has already been working, but to find avenues for the hundreds of other parishioners who don't do bible studies or "The Chosen" to grow in their knowledge and practice of the their Catholic faith.

The faith formation team met for the first time last week, and from what I took away, this group has great passion for their faith along with strong leadership qualities. (There may still be a spot or two left on the team, if anyone's interested.) There certainly is great potential for this team to take parishioners to the next level of faith understanding and formation.

What we will see in one form or another is the six dimensions of adult faith formation as established by Catholic bishops in the United States: Knowledge of the Faith, Liturgical Life, Moral Formation, Prayer, Communal Life and Missionary Spirit. For too many regular Mass-goers, everything about our faith is within the confines of St. Joseph Church, when in actuality, we should be taking what we've learned and carry it out into the secular world. Our knowledge of our faith (including biblical knowledge), a moral foundation, (including why the Church teaches what it does on today's social issues) and missionary spirit, (including the ability to talk confidently about our faith in the secular world). The new team will help us in growing stronger in these areas.

Keep your eyes open and read <u>all</u> of the bulletin for these upcoming faith initiatives. Let's prepare this parish for a strong future.
