

(and whatever else is on Deacon Eric's mind)

We survived

Well, here we are. The world did not come to an end, democracy survived and so did we. We survived a presidential election, or perhaps I should say we survived the season of political advertising and blatant misrepresentation (aka fibbing or lying) leading up to the election. Where we go from here as a country is anybody's guess, but we know the worst TV ads genre will now return to the realm of prescription drugs and full body deodorants.

In some ways, we are today in a period that parallels the period right after the Great Flood in the Bible. God had become extremely upset at human beings because in his eyes "every desire that their heart conceived was always nothing but evil (Gen 6:5)." Yet he showed faith in Noah and the Lord repaid Noah for his faith in building the Ark and gathering the animals, by making a covenant not to destroy the world again -- conceding that "that human hearts are evil from youth (Gen 8:21)."

We know that also, because we know we are all sinners. We also know that any problems that may exist in the model of democracy are man-made, yet we also maintain that we can survive anything with faith in God. Last Sunday's readings give us a wonderful reminder that we must hold on to our faith. In the first reading, Elijah asks a widow for a small cake to eat and she shows faith in the Lord though she believes that she has only enough flour and oil for one last meal for herself and her son. She makes the cake for Elijah after he relays God's promise that she will always have enough flour and oil for her and her son. In the gospel, we heard the parable of the widow who donate her last coins to the temple treasury, showing her total faith in the Lord.

Yes, we survived another presidential election. It appears at this moment that one party will control the White House and both chambers of Congress. That usually means a great deal of legislation will get passed over at least the next two years, depending on what happens in 2026's mid-term election of the House of Representatives. That will please many and upset others. But we need not let political decisions rule our lives. We can't let politics become our religion. We need to retain our faith and stay on the path that leads to Jesus.

So let's pray over the next couple of years that our leaders find a way to return to the spirit and practice of compromise, which is supposed to be essence of politics. And let's also pray that going forward, our leaders may legislate by respecting the freedom of religion under which our country was founded and doing so while maintaining the need for basic human dignity. We survived. Let's pray that we learned something along the way.

You are **NOT** a registered parishioner!

Why is it important to be registered in the parish:

- We can reach you with important information about the parish and it's ministries
- We have a more accurate idea of the number of parishioners we have in the parish.
- It allows us to seek your input and feedback.
- It allows you to formally support the parish financially, since envelopes will be issued to you for your use.
- We can start a sacramental record for you.
- Finally, registering can also help you have a greater sense of belonging to and ownership of the parish.

Please note:

The **envelopes** you receive when registering **will** now play an important role in the reception of the sacraments. (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage. It is also a guide for Sponsors for Confirmation or Godparent forms) in the parish. We're asking all parishioners to get into the habit of using your envelopes in the weekly collection. *Even if you give online or don't have anything to put in the envelope, please submit an empty envelope*. It will help us know how many registered parishioners attend a given Mass and it will also come in handing for determining if a person, presenting themselves for a sacrament, is attending Mass regularly as is required.
