

Thanksgiving -- Let's Fight to Keep It

Thanks to the Knights of Columbus, we have yearly reminders that we need to "Keep Christ in Christmas." And we have long heard the phrase "Remember the reason for the season" that more generically reminds us to fight the commercialism that comes along with the Christmas season and instead focus on the birth of our Savior. In that same vein, I propose that we really take some time to reflect on this week's holiday and put the "thanks" back into Thanksgiving.

Certainly, the American celebration of the first Thanksgiving in 1621 is not at all comparable in importance to the birth of Jesus. But it does give us an opportunity to stop and think about everything for which we should be thankful to God. In saying at the top of the column that we need to fight to keep it, I am referencing that fact that it is being squeezed out of the fall holiday season by the commercialized bookends of Halloween and Christmas.

As soon as the shelves of school supplies become empty at the end of August and the beginning of September, they are being refilled with Halloween displays. Then as the shelves become empty again after costumes disappear, they are filled with Christmas displays, or sadly, as some national chains have mandated, "holiday displays."

Certainly the day of Thanksgiving is not in danger of disappearing, now that there is 12 hours of football to go with turkey and pumpkin pie, but in my eyes, the fight is to keep "thanks" at the top of the day's chart. Thanks to God to live in the most blessed country in the world, thanks for religious freedom (though still a struggle) and thanks for family, friends and whatever is near and dear to our hearts -- but first and foremost for the day, "thanks" to the Lord.

This is the essence of the Clinton Community Thanksgiving Celebration and Dinner. It is the coming together of people from various churches in the community to thank God for all the gifts the Lord has given us -- as individuals and as a community. The religious service to start the celebration (and "Yes" Catholics can attend) acknowledges

the end of the harvest season in a spirit of thanks through psalms, songs and a remembrance of the first Thanksgiving at Plymouth Rock in 1621. The celebration includes a kids table and a big-screen TV showing the Super Bowl-Bound Lions (maybe) to go along with a traditional meal - and a not-so-traditional vegetarian lasagna.

Thanks was certainly the order of the day for the Pilgrims and Native Americans at the first Thanksgiving celebration, giving thanks for a bountiful harvest which followed a brutal winter. Though this event had been celebrated for a hundred years, it got its official recognition by President George Washington and was named a national holiday by Abraham Lincoln in 1863. 




