



WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

Joy Short-lived

Palm Sunday Mass always begins with a reading of Jesus' joyous entry into Jerusalem, as ushers hand out palms to Massgoers. Each of the four gospel writers has a version of the procession, with Luke's account front and center this year. What makes it noteworthy in some respects is that it is so short.

The fifth season of the TV series "The Chosen" has just been released in movie theaters and I recently heard an interview about this story with the actor who plays Jesus in the series, Jonathon Roumie. Although all actors try to "get into character" for their roles, Roumie says he really got swept up into the joy of the people as he portrayed Jesus riding into Jerusalem, noting he truly experienced what it must have been like for Jesus in the midst of such adulation. His huge smile echoed the emotion.

This scene in "The Chosen" also showed

the apostles running alongside Jesus, jumping up and down, pumping their arms into the air and shouting with joy. The celebration was as if Jesus were the star as his team won the Super Bowl, the World Series and the Stanley Cup. In essence, the apostles were saying to those who lined the road that "we're with him (Jesus), we're his disciples and we're going to be important people when he becomes king."

The apostles still didn't get it. They thought in terms of themselves as the crowd was cheering Jesus so enthusiastically. How often do we live our lives with that same attitude -- us first, Jesus second, or maybe even lower for some?

The gospel accounts vary a bit about what happened at the end of the ride. Matthew and Luke have the cleansing of the temple -- the overthrowing of the moneychangers' tables immediately upon arriving. Mark has Jesus assessing the commerce in the temple area, then returning the next day. John has Jesus confronting the moneychangers early in his gospel account, right after the wedding feast at Cana. But the bottom line is that Jesus' ride into Jerusa-

lem was only a few miles, and as such, his joy was very short-lived, before the reality of his Jerusalem visit set in.

Though most of us refer to this Sunday as Palm Sunday, others note it as Passion Sunday. Officially, however, it is known as Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. And in real time we experience the change from Palm Sunday because seven or eight minutes after we hear the account of Jesus' joyous trip we hear of the Passion and death of Our Lord.

On the way from Galilee to Jerusalem Jesus preached, knowing all along how the trip was going to end. The Father allowed his Son a few moments of joyous human emotion before he was crucified. Three days later, his Resurrection made possible a permanent joy for all.

This is a great opportunity for families to prepare for their Easter celebration. Holy Week is long with waiting and watching. Putting together this basket gives kids (of all ages) a wonderful way to spend some time on Saturday morning preparing for our Easter Celebration.

We will gather around at the front of the altar to have this blessing. The tradition of this Easter Basket of blessed foods is shared at Easter morning breakfast. Be sure to include some Easter candy in the basket that will be the first Easter candy eaten. Some items to include may be:


