Praying for a Pope

*O God, faithful rewarder of souls,
grant that your departed servant Pope
Francis, whom you made successor of
Peter and shepherd of your Church,*

*may happily enjoy for ever in your pres-
ence in heaven the mysteries of your
grace and compassion, which he faithfully
ministered on earth.*

*Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity
of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever*

This prayer comes from the Roman Missal rubrics of the Mass for the Dead, specifically for a Pope. The news of Pope Francis' death is fresh as I write this, but by the time this column reaches its readers his funeral is likely to have passed and perhaps dates for a conclave have already been set.

It's also possible most of us have had our

share of retrospectives and are ready to move on to selecting a new Pope, but nothing moves quickly in the Catholic Church and we all need to exercise patience. And patience is a virtue, the moral virtue stemming from the virtue of fortitude.

Pope Francis made himself available to reporters on long plane trips and sometimes that led to comments that made international headlines, because his choice of words sometimes seemed to divert from Catholic teaching. I won't go into specifics because I try to keep this column apolitical and by now all the news organization have beaten those topics to a pulp.

With this Sunday's designation by the Church as Divine Mercy Sunday, I would like to focus on remembrances of Pope Francis as a man of peace and of mercy. Before poor health sidelined him, Pope Francis traveled the world, evangelizing on behalf of the Church, but also taking his message of peace and mercy to warring nations.

Many of those nations have few, if any, Catholics But he lived the life of a bishop,

who is, first and foremost charged with the role of spreading the "Good News of Jesus Christ." He was a man of great humility -- once kissing the feet of leaders of both sides of an African conflict. And war was a constant target of his in his travels, always urging warring parties to settle their differences at the bargaining table.

Being Pope in my mind is the hardest job in the world. No matter what a Pope says, he will be criticized by the secular world, by other Christian faiths or by those within the Catholic Church. Sometimes his words are criticized at all three levels. But we could do a lot worse than have a spiritual leader whose focus is on the downtrodden, and who constantly preaches mercy and peace -- much like our spiritual leader whose Resurrection we just celebrated.

Position Opening: Part-time School Custodian

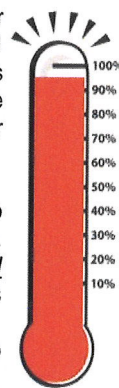
