



WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

"Are Ya fer Me or Agin Me?"
Sorry, I slipped into my cowboy persona for a second. Those fans of TV and movie westerns can relate to the title of

for a second. Those fans of TV and movie westerns can relate to the title of today's talk, which is, of course, Cowboy-ese for: "Are you with me or against me?" Actually, this grammatically correct question was asked by Jesus in Matthew 12:30 and his point is clear: There is no neutral ground when it comes to following the Lord. We're either "all in or all out" when it comes to being disciples of Christ, whether it's in first century Galilee or 21st century America. Same attitude -- different context in Wild West days, however.

But when it comes to the question of faith versus reason or the Church versus science, it's not an either-or case -- though some philosophers may argue that this is most certainly the situation. St. Thomas Aquinas, however, came to the conclusion in the 13th century that faith and reason are not only compatible, but rather intertwined. There certainly are, and have been, those who say faith

is unprovable, so seek truth only in science; or on the flip side truth is only available in the bible; and finally, those who say faith is subjective (i.e. faith may be true for me, but it may not be for you). If we only had someone to clear this all up for us.

Fortunately, we do. It's our homeschool teacher friend Phillip Campbell, who is returning for his third visit to St. Joe's to give us his expertise in his talk this Thursday, May 15 th entitled "The Pursuit of Wisdom." Campbell, a Catholic history author as well as teacher, will enlighten us on the historical relationship between Catholicism and scientific inquiry.

In his own words from our bulletin promo: "When we understand the past, we can better understand how we arrived at our current situation -- and thus respond to those who believe that faith and reason are incompatible." The philosophical discussion on Church versus science began centuries before Aquinas, but it really exploded in the period known as the Enlightenment, which ran from the late 17th century until the early 19th century, with a heavy lean toward science. Campbell will walk us through

these long debated discussions in "The Pursuit of Wisdom."

I would be remiss if I did not give thanks to Moms today. I feel quite blessed in saying that not only did I have a great Mom, but I have a wife who is a great mother, in addition to three sisters, two daughters and two daughters-in-law who have been, and are continuing to be, wonderful mothers. Being a good mother has always been difficult and trying to raise a Christian family in today's antireligion culture is even harder. So I would like to offer a sincere "thank-you to all mothers who give (and gave) their all to bring up children as strong Christians. May God bless you all.







