

# WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

### From Deacon to Fr.

Most of us have too much on our plate to worry about "ceremony." We have to deal with the day-today hurdles of life -- illness, job loss, car repairs, paying the mortgage and so on. We have no time for pomp and circumstance. I would put myself in that group for most of my life. I could never figure out why so many Americans, for example, cared about British royalty and their ceremony. We fought a war some 250 years ago to free ourselves from British rule, why should we care who the fourth-in-line for the throne is dating? But I've had a bit of a change of heart in recent vears.

Last week's priest ordination for the Diocese of Lansing was a great reminder for me that there is a place in my life for ceremony, especially in the Catholic Church. We recently saw the great ceremony involved in the inauguration and installation of a new Pope. Tens of millions of people watched on TV across the world, Catholics and non-Catholics -- drawn by ceremony and what each action in the ceremony means.

I attended that ordination of new priests for the Lansing Diocese. Seven young men walked into Mass as transitional deacons and walked out as priests. They have lived the last year with the word Deacon in front of their names, and though they maintain the role of deacon as a result of their diaconate ordination -- to-day they can now put the word "Father" in front of their names.

The ceremony was wonderful, from the processional hymn's first line: "All creatures of our God and King, lift up your voice and with us sing" to the last line of the closing hymn: "to marvel at your beauty and glory in your ways, and make a joyful duty our sacrifice of praise." The Mass, left me full of spiritual energy and glad to be a Catholic. This ceremony was beautiful, and as one priest commented to me, "that was sacred.

There are those who say my joy stems from the fact that I have experienced ordination from the inside, in front of the bright lights. I won't deny that. I appreciate the fullness of an ordination ceremony more because the bishop laid his hands on me and prayed the Holy Spirit down and I laid my hands on the Book of the Gospels and promised to read, believe and teach the gospel. But I believe we can all better understand "ceremony" if we learn why certain actions and words take place.

History and tradition play a big part in ceremony, but the ordination ceremony is so much more. These seven young men are blessed with the powers handed down to them by Jesus through the bishops. They can now say Mass, absolve sins in Reconciliation and prepare the dying through the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Joy radiated from each of them as they processed out.

I no longer concern myself with Americans who follow British royalty. They can buy an issue of "People" magazine -- but stay away from Catholic ceremony. It's special.

- We can start a sacramental record for you.
- Finally, registering can also help you have a greater sense of belonging to and ownership of the parish.

# Please note:

The envelopes you receive when registering will now play an important role in the

reception of the sacraments. (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage) in the parish. This also includes Godparent selection. We're asking all parishioners to get into the habit of using your envelopes in the weekly collection. Even if you give online or don't have anything to put in the envelope, please submit an empty envelope. It will help us know how many registered parishioners attend a given Mass and it will also come in handing for determining if a person, presenting themselves for a sacrament, is attending Mass regularly as is required.


