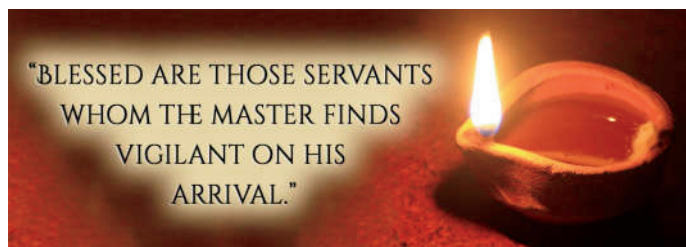

Pittsburgh Good

There was a network TV show called "This Is Us" that ran for six years on NBC -- ending in 2022. One of the many story lines was a flashback that had the character played by Mandy Moore as a 20-something" lead singer in a band from Pittsburgh who aspired to the bright lights of Los Angeles. With the help of her boyfriend, she made it to L.A. and got an appointment with an influential agent/producer who gave her an audition.

At the end of the audition he told her that her singing was good. But that he was looking for something special, something next level. When pressed by Moore and her boyfriend the agent finally said: "You're good, you're 'Pittsburgh good,' but this is L.A." The closest answer I got to my question was really an answer for everyone who is searching growth. That is to identify our strengths, our gifts from the Holy Spirit, and to max them out. And that goes for me as well, because my goal was to see if I can make my columns any better.

So far, I know they are at least "St. Johns good" or else they would have been canned. They might even be "Pittsburgh good" but I'll never know because I'm not going to Pittsburgh to find out. I do know I will follow Lino's lead and play to my strengths and to see how good they might be.

Parents Seeking Sacraments for Children:

If you are seeking a sacrament for yourself or your child, please make sure you are first an active participating member of the parish. That means that you are formally registered and participating in the life of the parish, especially participating in community worship through weekly attendance at Weekend Masses. When you are here for Mass, it is important that you place your contribution envelope in the collection, *even if it is empty*. There is no way I can possibly know how often, or even if a person is attending Mass otherwise. Extra envelopes will be available in the back of church in case you forgot to bring yours with you. So, please use your envelopes by placing them in the collection each time you come to Mass. This will allow me to verify a person's Mass attendance quickly and easily when they present themselves (or their children) for Baptism, First Eucharist, Confirmation, Godparents and Confirmation sponsors, or Marriage. When it comes to this policy you should know, multiple envelopes put in at a weekend Mass will be considered participation for that one Mass. Additionally, envelopes dropped off or mailed into the parish will not be considered participation at Mass. Thank you in advance for your cooperation on this matter.
