



Bringing the Heat

Baseball is a sport that is full of clichés and catch-phrases. Many of us have probably heard unique phrases at Little League games like "steppin" in the bucket" to describe a batter who tends to step away from a pitch instead of toward it. We may have also heard the term "can of corn" when there is an easily catchable fly ball to the outfield. The term actually comes from the early 1900s, when cans of corn were often stacked high on local market shelves. A storekeeper or stock boy would use a long stick or broom handle to knock a can of corn from the top shelf. making for an easy catch as it fell.

Another term, used in higher leagues still today, is "bringing the heat" to describe a pitcher's fastball. "Bringing the heat" in major league baseball nowadays could mean a pitch in excess of 100 miles per hour. A catcher without enough padding in his glove can really feel the heat if he doesn't catch it in the webbing of his mitt. But baseball is really not today's focus – but heat is.

In today's gospel from Luke, Jesus "brings the heat" in a pointed speech to his disciples: He says: "I have come to set the earth on fire and how I wish it were already blazing." It was a blazing fastball to the psyche of the disciples. They must have been thinking "Is this the same Jesus whom we have often heard preach in a way to bring people together?" It most certainly was and is. He undoubtedly split families back then, as he does now, because that's the way we are, people who have trouble agreeing. Most of us, know of people in our own families who were raised Catholic, but who do not now practice their faith.

Scholars say there is a two-fold purpose in terms of the fire he preaches about here. The first might reference the end of days, when the wheat is separated from the chaff, which is then tossed into the eternal fire. The fire in Luke's account of Jesus' might also refer to the tongues of fire that appeared over the apostles' heads at Pentecost – the fire of the Holy Spirit.

Standing alone, these words of Jesus are startling, but upon reflection we can see that he is encouraging those who believe to keep the faith burning. Come on Holy Spirit: "bring the heat."

NOTE: Don't forget to attend the third program in our Summer Faith Formation Series entitled "Understanding the Inquisition" this Wednesday, August 20 th at 6:00 in the church basement. For many people the word Inquisition' conjures up images of cruel torture devices used by the Church. But there is much more to the Inquisition – for starters there were several Inquisitions in Medieval Europe and they did not all involve the Church. As in her previous presentations this summer on Pope Pius XII and the Crusades, Amanda Grigar will try to clear up some of the misinformation we may have come to believe about the Medieval Inquisition. Perhaps we will find that the Church was not quite the "bad guy" secular historians have made us out to be.
