

Coming Back to Catholicism

Cardinal Timothy Dolan wrote an interesting article this past week noting the return of young people to the Catholic Church. Cardinal Dolan, the Archbishop of New York, wrote in the New York Post, that he engaged in conversations with other cardinals from around the world who were all echoing the same refrain — young people are slowly making their way back to the Church. This is a reversal of a trend that went on for decades. The question is "Why?" Or better yet, "Why now?"

The cardinals, as a group, were amazed at the number of young people in Rome this summer, not only gathering around the announcement of a new Pope, but those who had come in response to the Jubilee Year of Hope. When Cardinal Dolan returned to New York after Pope Leo XIV was elected he began asking the pastors in his Archdiocese if they had noticed any rise in the number of teenagers and young adults in the last couple of years. The answer was a resounding "Yes."

There is some data to back up what the cardinal is referencing, specifically a survey of people in what is known as Generation Z, that showed a six percent increase in 13-28 year-olds attending Mass regularly. The survey was taken by Harvard University in 2022 and 2023 and whose results are showing up in the form of young people in the pews here in 2025 across the United States. A similar trend has shown up in France and England.

This leads us back to the questions I posed earlier as to what has changed in the minds of those returning to, or coming into, the Church. The cardinal's article suggests he doesn't have one specific answer to the questions, though he does have some relevant thoughts on the situation.

At the top of his list is the witness of young saints who grew up in the era Generation Z, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis who will be canonized next week. He says College campus ministries are a big draw as well, not to mention the state of the world saying: "War, injustice, famine, violence, bigotry, mass shootings, political vitriol — those inclined to look to the world for meaning now know better." As previous polls have shown, a growing number of

young adults describing themselves as having no religious affiliation whatsoever, and with suicide rates going up at the same time, maybe young adults are being drawn to the stability of Catholic teaching.

Maybe, the era of "everything is relative, there are no rules" is coming to an end. Maybe young people are starting to see that there is great comfort in believing in a definitive right and wrong – that there is objective good and evil, and that there is purpose in our lives. Maybe they are starting to see that there is eternal life and it is attainable through Jesus Christ.

The numbers are small to this point. There's a long way to go. There are a couple thousand baptized Catholics within our parish boundaries who are not attending Mass. In a couple weeks, Fr. Mike will be unveiling an evangelization initiative designed to bring them back to their spiritual home.






